

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SPIRITUAL MURDER **Michael Pickford**

physically murdered. We often hear about it on the news. What we don't hear on the TV is the greater tragedy of someone being murdered spiritually. Satan seeks to murder us all spiritually. Here's how he succeeds with many...

Starved to Death. It is tragic when someone is starving to death physically. Spiritual starvation is worse. Satan has managed to edge his way into folk's schedules in such a way as to prevent them from feeding daily from the word of God. Jesus said "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4). The Bible presents every word that God has given to us. We cannot go on living spiritually without a daily diet from it. Those in Berea studied the word "Daily" (Acts 17:11), so must we!

Scared to Death. Our "Adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour" (1 Peter 5:8). The Lion is referred to as the king of the jungle. This is interesting since he really isn't the fastest or the strongest. What gives him his edge is his ferocious roar. He roars just before attacking, scaring his intended prey. It's always tragic when someone is prey is vulnerable and the lion takes advantage. Spiritually, Satan roars in many ways, scaring Christians to their spiritual demise. Some are scared out of their service to the Lord with threats from their government. Because of their faith in Jesus they risk imprisonment or even execution. It was in this context that the Lord said "Be faithful until death and I will give you the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10). Some are scared away from the Lord by criticism or ostracism from their friends, family or co-workers. Don't be scared to death!

> Smothered to Death. Some are choked out by the cares of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches (Matthew 13:22). They began with zealous service to the Lord; but their jobs, their entertainment, their activities, their sports, their children's activities became so important and burdensome that serving the Lord took a back seat. Daily family bible study and prayer were replaced with games and practices, late hours at the office, late nights with sports and video games, etc. Attending services, visiting the sick and other responsibilities are also hindered or eliminated. They've been smothered to death. -Don't let Satan murder you! \sim

Think of Elvis Presley, Sandra Dee, Marilvn Monroe or James Dean. These were popular "Teen Idols." Young people upheld them highly and longed to be like them. They patterned their lives after their habits and styles. I don't hear the term "Teen Idol" much anymore but the concept is still around. Today, the word "Hero" is used a lot. "Michael Jordan is my hero." Or, "Dennis Rodman is my hero." Enjoying sports and leisure time is healthy for children and adults alike. But I'm concerned when so much of our young people's time is saturated in these things that they begin to consider sports figures, rock stars or actors as the kind of people they want to "be like" when they grow up. Especially, when many of these "Teen Idols" are so ungodly.

First of all, I don't like the word "Idol," simply because of what it suggests. Secondly, why do we not hear more from our youth about wanting to grow up to be like the preacher, an elder, or an older, godly woman in the church? Wouldn't it be nice to hear a young child say something like, "Jesus is my hero," or "the apostle Paul is my hero?" Or what about "Daddy is my hero," "Mommy is my hero," or "Grandma is my hero." Perhaps if we would stop saturating their time in one sport after another, or one television program after another, and start saturating more of their time in biblical studies and principles (Deut. 6:7-9), we would hear more of this kind of thing from them. Who is your child's "Hero" or "Idol?" Who does your child want to be like when he (she) grows up? Who do **vou** want to be like?

Paul wrote, "Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ" (1 Cor. 11:1). The idea of people wanting to be like godly men and women is a biblical one. Ultimately we should strive to be like God. Ephesians 5:1 says, "Therefore be imitators of God as dear children." John wrote about Christ, "He who says he abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as he walked" (1 John 2:6). Surround your children with cheerful godliness, and they will want to be godly people.

A BRIGHT FUTURE

It's hard when our future doesn't look bright. The difficulty is intensified when we see the wicked of the world go on seemingly exempt from the troubles we're enduring. But for the faithful child of God, the ultimate future is always bright, regardless of earthly circumstances. "Do not let your heart envy sinners, But be zealous for the fear of the Lord all the day; for surely there is a hereafter, and your hope will not be cut off" –Proverbs 23:17-18
