

WHAT'S IN YOUR HOUSE? Michael Pickford

We're told that Hezekiah did what was right in the sight of the Lord (2 Kings 18:3). But he made a serious mistake. After he had been healed by God, the king of Babylon sent an envoy to visit him. Hezekiah showed them everything from the treasures to the stores of food. "There was nothing in his house or in all his dominion that Hezekiah did not show them" (2 Kings 20:13). This was a mistake, as sharing all this made them vulnerable to the enemy. Isaiah came to rebuke him for his grievous error. Isaiah said "What have they seen in your house?" -2 Kings 20:15. This is a good question for us. What do folks see in our house?

Your Family. What does your family see in your house? Do the children see the parents being hypocrites? Do they see them go to church on Sunday but live lives through the week that contradict things taught there? Do they see an unloving husband and wife who constantly bicker, argue and fight? (Ephesians 5:22-33). Or do they see parents teaching them discipline and bringing them up in the training and admonition of the Lord? (Ephesians 6:1-4). What do they see in your house?

Your Friends. What do your friends see? Do they know your home to be a place of hospitality? Is it clear to them that as a child of God you are truly "Given to hospitality?" (Romans 12:13). Do folks know you to be a family that likes to have others over for an occasional meal, or to open up the home for other activities? If they came to your house, would they find regular bible study and prayer? Do you have the reputation on your block of being good people, good neighbors, concerned and caring? What do they see in your house?

Your Father. We all know that nothing can be hidden from the Lord. "The eyes of the Lord are in every place, Keeping watch on the evil and the good" (Proverbs 15:3). "All things are naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we must give account" (Hebrews 4:13). Even when the doors are shut, blinds closed, and curtains drawn, God knows what we're doing in our homes. He knows if we're watching that seedy sit-com or that morally depraved movie. He knows if we spend time with his word or not. He knows if we're praving regularly. He knows how we really treat our spouses and our children. What does God see in your house? \sim

Have you ever noticed that God often places His blessings "in" Something?

The tree of life was located in the garden, and as long as Adam and Eve remained there, they could eat of it and live forever. The blessing was "in" the garden, but due to sin, God drove them "out of the garden" (Genesis 3:23).

God told Noah and His family to go "into" the ark, and they did so (Genesis 7:9). Those outside the ark all drowned, just as Noah and his family would have had they not been "in" the ark. Again, the blessing of salvation was "in" something – An Ark!

In order to avoid being destroyed, the Israelites were to place blood on the lintel and doorposts, and then remain "in" the house. If any first born children were found on the outside of the house they would die (Exodus 12:13, 22). Again, the blessing of salvation was "in" something – A House!

If someone were to accidentally kill another, they were to flee to a city of refuge in order to escape the avenger (Numbers 35:9-34; Joshua

20:1-9). He was to remain within the city. As long as he was "in" the city, the avenger could not kill him. But if he left the city's boundaries, he could be slain by the avenger. Again, the blessing of salvation was "in" something – A City!

Paul was on a ship as a slave being transferred to Rome (Acts 27:13-38). There was a great storm, the ship was breaking up, and those aboard were about to jump off and try to swim for shore. But Paul, speaking with directions from God, told them that if everyone didn't remain "in" the ship, no one could be saved (Vs. 31). This time, the blessing of salvation was "in" a ship.

The Garden, the ark, a house, a city, and a ship; are you beginning to see a pattern? What about eternal salvation? You guessed it. It is also "in" something. Paul wrote in 2 Timothy 2:10 about the "salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory." Salvation is "in" Christ! How does one get "in" Christ? Easy, "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ" (Galatians 3:27). Have you been baptized? Are you "IN?" \sim
