depicted in the Bible as a race. We should run with discipline, keeping our eye on the prize, realizing the possibility of being disqualified (1 Corinthians 9:25-27). We must run according to the rules, the doctrine of Christ (2 Timothy 2:5; 2 John 9); and we must finish the race, that is, faithfully keep the faith until death (2 Timothy 4:6-8). During this race, the faith of men long ago cheer us on to victory, as we keep our eyes on the Lord (Hebrews 12:1-2). The Hebrews writer urges us to run with endurance the race "That is set before us." Some want to enter the Christian race and then choose their own track. isn't how it works; we must run the race set before us. In running this track, we must be...

Set for Resistance. It is a shame, but the fact is when we become children of God folks are going to resist us. In times past, as well as in some parts of the world today, Christians have had to face extreme persecution, sometimes even death, because of their faith. Jesus said "Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10). We sometimes face resistance from our

The life of a Christian is often families, but the Lord taught that we must love Him more (Matthew 10:37-

> Skilled for Retaliation. There are many, especially false teachers, who will retaliate against our faith. They don't criticize the fact that we're in the race, they just try to teach us to change the rules. They try to choose their own track by changing or ignoring essential truths of the Gospel. We must be ready to give an answer for the things we believe (1 Peter 3:15). We must study to become skilled in the word of God so we might not be tossed to and fro by every wind of doctrine (Acts 17:11; Ephesians 4:11-15). We must be prepared to "contend earnestly for the faith" (Jude 3).

> Suited for Resilience. Ever hear someone say about another, "He's just not suited for this job?" We must be suited in Christ so that we might be resilient to the things Satan flings at us (Ephesians 6:10-20). This requires diligent daily study (Acts 17:11), regular attendance of worship services (Hebrews 10:24-25), and diligent persistent prayer (1 Thessalonians 5:17). Through these, Christ gives us the strength we need for victory (Philippians 4:13).

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# HATRED Michael Pickford

From nearly the beginning of time this work of the flesh (Galatians 5:20), hatred, has existed. It was exemplified in Cain as he rose up to kill his brother Abel. Paul writes that those who hate will not inherit the kingdom of God.

"Hatred" literally means, "antipathies, and want of love, producing contentions and strifes." This attribute is opposed to love and kindness. This word describes the feeling of hatred within one's heart without the action it produces, but hatred can lead to evil acts. proverbs writer defined this word well when he wrote, "Hatred stirs up strife" (Proverbs 10:12). In fact, in Paul's list of the works of the flesh, he gave "contentions" as the next sin after hatred. The Lord taught that hatred leads to murder (Matthew 21-26).

Many people, even Christians in some cases, have hatred in their hearts for various different people. There are some who hate their parents, but the Bible says to honor your father and your mother (Ephesians 6:2). Some hate their enemies, but Lord said to

love your enemies (Matthew 5:44). Some hate their brother or their sister, but John wrote, "He who says he is in the light, and hates his brother, is in darkness until now..." (1 John 2:9). Some people have come to hate their bosses, but Paul wrote that we should serve them as if we were working for the Lord. Do you hate the Lord? Some do, (John 7:7). Then there are those who are "haters of God" (Romans 1:30).

Indeed, this evil attribute of hatred is felt in the hearts of many for various different people in their lives. What a shame! People who carry around hatred become very bitter people and usually live their lives with no true inner peace. "Better is a dinner of herbs where love is, than a fatted calf with hatred" (Proverbs 15:17). Their lives become even worse when they act upon that hatred by involving themselves in fights and malicious acts, including murder. But the worst comes when they face God on judgment day and are condemned for their hatred. LOVE!
