

SEPARATION OF CHURCH AND WORLD Michael Pickford

We hear a lot about separation of separation of church and world? It seems that many churches have let the influence of the world enter in full force. And what about individual Christians? Consider 1 John 2:15-17 and note some important things about the world

The World is There. 1 John 2:15 speaks about the reality of the world around us. The world is real; the world exists: the world is all around us: the world is there. God has placed us in this world and we are to live in it, but not of it. We are not to love the world itself. John isn't speaking of the people of the world. Certainly we should love everyone, even our enemies (Matthew 5:44). God so loved the world (people). But we are not to love the world itself; that is, we are not to become too attached to this world and get too comfortable here. We must remember that our true citizenship is in heaven (Philippians 3:20). Further, we are not to love the things in the world; material things. They can take our hearts captive and deceive us, leading us away from the Lord. Friendship with the world is enmity with God (James 4:4).

The World is Tempting. 1 John 2:16 church and state; but what about speaks of these temptations. The lust of the eyes and of the flesh, along with the pride of life has caused the downfall of many. Some sins are more alluring to some than others. But be sure that Satan has enough influence out there to offer something for everyone. We must strive to separate ourselves from tempting situations. We cannot go out of the world (1 Corinthians 5:10), but we can use some wisdom and proper judgment as to how and where we spend our time. Flee fornication, idolatry, youthful lusts, and the love of money (1 Corinthians 6:18; 10:14; 1 Timothy 6:11; 2 Timothy 2:22).

> The World is Temporary. 1 John 2:17 teaches us this. Whatever it is, if you can lay your eyes on it, kiss it goodbye. This world and everything in it will be burned up in the last day (2 Peter 3:10). Don't be so foolish as to allow something temporary to earn your focus and divert your attention away from the invisible eternal things. We're interested in value. Well, this world offers nothing of eternal value, but heaven holds all things valuable. So be careful to "Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth" (Colossians 3:2). 🔎
