

# HOW SWEET IT IS! Michael Pickford

Consider some things that are called sweet in the Bible...

Scripture. "How sweet are Your words to my taste. Sweeter than honey to my mouth!" (Psalm 119:103). Sometimes we find ourselves with a relentless craving for something sweet. This is the way we should always feel about the sweet word of God. "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be filled" (Matthew 5:6). The word of God should be a part of our daily diet (Acts 17:11). Ignorance of God's word always leads to destruction (Hosea 4:6). In the Bible we find saving words (Romans 1:16).

Sleep. If you will live your life according to God's wisdom and sound discretion, "Then you will walk safely in your way, and your foot will not stumble. When you lie down, you will not be afraid; Yes, you will lie down and your sleep will be sweet" (Proverbs 3:23-24). The greatest tormentor of the human soul is a guilty conscience. How sweet Paul's sleep must have been due to having lived his life "In all good conscience before God" (Acts 23:1). When we do wrong

Most folks like sweet things. and sin, our inner sense of justice pricks us until we make things right again. A Good conscience will give us sweet sleep in this life and sweet rest in the afterlife if we serve God accordingly. Do right and you will spend your nights on a soft pillow enjoying sweet sleep.

Speech. Have you ever spoken words that you knew cut right through the heart of the listener; bitter words that were meant to hurt? Maybe you've done this unintentionally, not having the wisdom of what to say at the right moment. Words have great power, and can cause great damage. But sweet words can heal, help, comfort and exhort. "The heart of the wise teaches his mouth, And adds learning to his lips. Pleasant words are like a honeycomb, Sweetness to the soul and health to the bones" (Proverbs 16:23-24). Too often folks use their tongues for gossip and slander, and then try to praise God. This is bitterness rather than sweetness. "Out of the same mouth proceed blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not to be so. Does a spring send forth fresh water and bitter from the same opening?" (James 3:10-11). Let our speech always be with grace (Colossians 4:6). 🔑


attempted to make use of the old saying "Every nook and cranny." Unfortunately, it didn't come out quite right (Crook and Nanny?). But this phrase is one that we've heard and used most of our lives. I decided to look up some definitions and I have learned that a nook is defined as "A corner, as in a room," "Any secluded or obscure corner" -Dictionary.com. The same source defines a cranny as "a small, narrow opening in a wall, rock, etc.; chink; crevice; fissure." When one says he has searched every nook and cranny, he means that he has done a full, complete and exhaustive search of every possible place the missing item could be. This reminded me of some important spiritual lessons...

"Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith" (2 Corinthians 13:5). Most of us see the value in an occasional physical self examination. We sometimes look over our skin to make sure there are no suspicious looking moles or lesions. These self examinations could very well save our lives one day. But what about that essential spiritual examination; how are we doing there? We need to often look deep inside our spiritual lives, searching every nook and cranny, leaving no stone unturned, to be sure we are still remaining faithful. Are there unholy habits we have developed, such as neglecting prayer and daily Bible study? Perhaps we have allowed unholy dispositions to overtake us unawares, such as discontent, which leads to a complaining personality.

> But there is another spiritual lesson here. When God through Zephaniah was warning of the destruction that was coming. He said "I will search Jerusalem with lamps..." (Zephaniah 1:12). This means that God will search out every nook and cranny. No one will escape the punishment to come. But every punishment recorded in the Bible reflects that final great day of judgment. And on this day, God will also search out with lamps. No one will be able to hide from God on that day. We will face our Maker. The Lord Jesus Himself has been appointed as Judge (Acts 17:31), and He will judge us based upon the deeds done in the body, whether good or evil (2 Corinthians 5:10). In this judgment, He will leave no stone unturned as He searches out every nook and cranny of our soul. We became confident that we had successfully hidden that certain sin from the eyes of men, and perhaps we had, but the Lord will lay it bare "In the day when God will judge the secrets of men by Jesus Christ" (Romans 2:16).

> The very thought of this should cause us to tremble. And once we begin to tremble, this should prompt us to do that spiritual self examination. When we find these sins, we must repent and confess them and obtain forgiveness now while there is still time (1 John 1:9; Acts 8:22).
