

NEEDY CHILDREN Michael Pickford

It is tragic that so many children in **Discipline**. this world are in situations of great poverty, not possessing even the most basic needs for the support of life. More tragic still are those children in need of a proper upbringing by strong, supportive, godly parents. It is essential for parents to realize that their children need proper...

Direction. *"Train up a child in the* way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6). A New Testament counterpart to this bit of divine wisdom says "Fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4). The first passage mentions the way he should go; the second tells us what this way is: The training and admonition of the Lord. Too many children are being directed in any way but the Lord's way; even those being brought up by "Christian parents." Often, more emphasis is placed on sports, making good grades in school, securing a lucrative career, etc. than on putting the Lord and His work first regardless of the sacrifices that must be made. By the way, if you train them up in the way they shouldn't go, they are likely to take that path.

In speaking of "Needy" children today, it seems painfully obvious that too many children are neglected when it comes to discipline. The old adage "Spare the rod, spoil the child" is not found in the Bible, but the concept is certainly taught, and in much stronger terms. A small sample of such passages says "He who spares his rod hates his son. But he who loves him disciplines him promptly." The world has this backwards, saying that a parent hates his child when he whips him. As a consequence, children are brought up with no respect for authority. What a disservice toward a child to withhold the rod! I guarantee you that when he gets out into the world and disrespects the rules the result will be pain! It won't be viewed as "Cute" or "Funny." If your child is "Begging for a whipping," show him your love and give it to him!

Demonstration. My children need to see me living the right kind of life. All too often the child of a drunk will himself become a drunk. The same is true of a spouse abuser, smoker, etc. Demonstrate to them a faithful walk with God; show him the way and he is likely to follow. Children are insightfully sensitive to hypocrisy. Supply spiritual needs to your children!

Students in school, whether it's the first twelve or college, understand what it means to "Cram" for a test. It's the idea of "cramming" as much information into your head as possible, usually the night before the test is to be taken. Of course a student who has studied diligently and worked hard throughout the semester does not have so great a need to "cram" for a test as those who have been slothful in their studies.

The Final Exam is literally a time when we must give account of ourselves as to what we have learned in the class.

Think with me for a minute about the greatest test man will ever take. I'm speaking of the great judgment of the last day when we will all stand before the Lord and give an account of the deeds of our lives (2 Corinthians 5:10). If we pass, eternal life; if we fail, eternal condemnation (Matthew 25:46).

I fear there are some in Christ who are waiting till the last minute to "cram" for judgment day. They are members of the church, they sometimes have hit and miss records of attendance, they rarely study God's word on their own, and they are not diligent in sharing the gospel with others. They're
