

THREE CRUCIFIXIONS Michael Pickford

"Two robbers were crucified with the left" (Matthew 27:38). But this isn't what I had in mind for this article. The Bible speaks of the...

Crucifixion of The Savior. "And led Him away to be crucified." (Matthew 27:31). Jesus died for the sins of the world (1 John 2:1-2). He died in order to make salvation available to all men (1 Timothy 4:10). In fact, while He never sinned Himself, he became sin for us (2 Corinthians 5:21; Isaiah 53:6). He took our sins upon Himself, paying our penalty. "He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities" (Isaiah 53:5). When Moses lifted up that serpent in the wilderness, he offered an opportunity for healing to those who had been bitten by the deadly snakes. But one bitten had to do something to receive the healing – he had to look at the serpent! Just believing the serpent was real wasn't enough. Even so, Jesus was lifted up on the cross to offer to us salvation from our sins (John 3:14); but we must do something to receive salvation - "Obev Him" (Hebrews 5:8-9). Just believing in Him isn't enough. "Even the demons believe - and tremble" (James 2:19)!

Crucifixion of The Sinner. "Knowing Him, one on the right and another on this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sins" (Romans 6:6). The old man was crucified when we were baptized into Christ (Romans 6:1-5). We must then live as if he is dead! This is Paul's point in Romans 6:1-14 ff. Do not let sin reign in your mortal bodies! (Romans 6:12). Stop dressing like the world, talking like the world, speaking like the world, living like the world! That's what the old man did, but he's supposed to be crucified! It would do us all good to often review the many passages which describe the character of the old man verses the new (Romans 6:6-14; Ephesians 4:17-32; Colossians 3:1-17; etc.)

> Crucifixion of The Saint. As a saint, Paul said "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me..." (Galatians 2:20). My desires, my whims, my goals, my fears, my worries...they have all been put to death! O how we need to realize that Christ demands complete devotion, not half-hearted dallying. We must stop aiming one eye at the world and the other at Jesus. He wants us fully and exclusively focused on Him. \sim
