


Welcome to our services and thank you for visiting. If you have any questions about our beliefs or practices, please don't hesitate to ask.

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BACK-BITERS & BITE-BACKERS Michael Pickford

The tongue can be the determining factor in where we will spend eternity. "For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned" (Matthew 12:37). In dealing with backbiters and bitebackers, consider the concepts of...

"Backbiters" are VILENESS. included in that list of sins that caused God to give a society over to a debased (Vile, reprobate) mind (Romans 1:26, 30). Backbiting is a vile use of the tongue. A backbiter is one who speaks disparagingly of another's character. One who "Runs them in the ground." We do this to those we don't like, but the Bible says to "Love your enemies" (Matthew 5:44). Sadly, it's often those closest to us, our friends, our family, or our brethren, that we find ourselves slandering. James wrote, "Out of the same mouth proceed blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not be so" (James 3:10). It is inconsistent to praise God out of one side of the mouth and then curse man. who was made in God's likeness, out of the other side of the mouth (see James 3:9).

<u>VENGEANCE</u>. These are the "Bite-backers." Those who bite back! Those who seek revenge when they

hear that someone has done them wrong, or spoken evil of them. If you learn that someone has spoken evil of you, your response should be to "Love" and "Pray" for them, for their souls are in jeopardy for the sin of slander. Love "Keeps no account of evil" (1 Corinthians 13:5 – see footnote in NKJV beside "Thinks no evil"). The idea is that when a loving person is wronged, he does not "Mark it down" and then seek for an opportunity to balance out the books by doing a wrong turn to the one who did them wrong. It hurts when we hear that someone. especially a friend, has said something bad about us, and the temptation to respond in an unholy manner is strong, but we must not retaliate! Vengeance belongs to the Lord (Romans 12:19).

VICTORY. How can we gain victory over sinful uses of the tongue? James wrote, "But no man can tame the tongue" (James 3:8). So why try? James isn't saying that I can't learn to control my tongue. The idea is that no "Man" by his own strength can do so. But through the strength of Christ I can take control of my words, and speak things that are graceful and edifying. "Be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might" (Ephesians 6:10).

LIKE A TREE

In three very important areas the the God who created all things! We Bible reveals that the godly individual need to heed the admonition given in is "like a tree."

1) The man who meditates day and LORD with all your heart, and lean not night in God's law "shall be like a tree" (Psalm 1:2-3). When we consistently spend time studying and reflecting upon the Word of God it makes us stronger in our faith and knowledge (2 Tim. 2:15; 2 Peter 3:18). This regular meditation in inspired Scripture will cause fruit to be born in our lives (v. 3; Luke 8:15; John 15:2). Reading and applying the Bible will cause our way to prosper (v. 3; James 1:25). So are you "like a tree" in this way? Do you have spiritual strength

and deep roots of faith because your *"delight is in the law of the LORD, and* in His law" you meditate "day and night"?

2) The man who trusts in the LORD "shall be like a tree" (Jeremiah 17:7-8). God stated in the previous verse that "the man who trusts in man...shall *be like a shrub in the desert*" (vv. 5-6). What a difference it will make in our lives if we make flesh our strength or

the Book of Proverbs. "Trust in the on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths" (3:5-6). Are you "like a tree" or "like a shrub" in the desert? It depends on where you've placed your trust.

3) The man whose hope is in the LORD "shall be like a tree" (Jeremiah 17:7-8). To hope in anyone or anything else in this life is futile. There is only "one hope" (Eph. 4:4). It is a hope that will not disappoint (Romans 5:5). This hope is "an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast" (Hebrews 6:19). This hope that we have in the Lord will help us to maintain purity in our lives (I John 3:3). Heaven is the most important goal of all, so let's "lay hold of the hope set before us" (Heb. 6:18). Is your hope in the Lord? If it is not, then you are without hope!

May each one of us be "like a tree" in these three vital areas! -
