- GIVING: 1 Corinthians 16:1,2; 2 Corinthians 9:6,7



LABOR DAY Michael Pickford

Labor Day was established to celebrate the social and economic achievements of American workers. Sometimes we might get into a mode where we love to celebrate the work the Lord has done to save us from our sins, but we're hesitant to accomplish the daily work God has called us to do in Christ (Titus 2:14; 1 Corinthians 15:58). Perhaps it would help us stay busy if we remember our...

<u>CONVERSION TO THE LORD</u>. we were created in Christ for good works (Ephesians 2:8-10; Titus 2:14). When we first obeyed the Lord we wanted to convert the world! But by and by that zeal dissolved. We've been beaten up, rejected, hurt, and insulted. Don't give up! Remember your first zeal, reignite that flame and keep it burning. After all, when someone you try to teach doesn't respond, this perceived failure is really a victory as it is working for you a grand prize.

<u>CONCERN FOR THE LOST</u>. God desires all men to come to the truth and be saved; He is not willing that any should perish (1 Timothy 2:3-4; 2 Peter 3:9). Shouldn't I imitate my heavenly Father in this desire (Ephesians 5:1)? Paul became all things to all men in hopes that he might "Save some"

(1 Corinthians 9:22). He persuaded, he pleaded, he prodded in order to convert the lost and keep the saved saved! (1 Corinthians 1:10; 2 Corinthians 5:11). Realizing the Lord's terror at Judgment, Paul persuaded men (2 Corinthians 5:9-11). Are we concerned that that nice young man at the bank is destined for eternal flames? Hand him a tract! Does it devastate us that that sweet young lady who checks us out at the grocery store each week is headed for damnation? Invite her to services!

CROWNING AT LAST. Paul kept the faith in anticipation of the crown of righteousness (2 Timothy 4:6-8). As an incentive to stay busy in the face of constant threats and setbacks, Paul kept his eye on the prize (2 Corinthians 4:16-18). In 1 Corinthians 15:58, Paul reminds us that we need to be steadfast, and immovable, and always abounding in the work of the Lord. But then he alluded to the prize, he wrote, "Knowing that your labors are not in vain in the Lord." We must not get lazy in the Lord. God has not called us to do-nothing Christianity! In order to stay invigorated, remember the crown the Lord promised to those who serve Him faithfully and fervently till death (Revelation 2:10).
