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PAUL & BAPTISM

Many today deny the necessity of baptism for salvation, yet they claim that Paul the apostle was a true disciple of Christ and inspired of the Holy Spirit. How did Paul feel about baptism? Would denominations today welcome his preaching, writing, and personal testimony? Let's Observe what Paul

PRACTICED. If Paul could give his "Personal testimony" in churches today regarding how he got saved, what would he say? Well, we're told that on the road to Damascus the Lord commanded him to go into the city and there he would be told what he "Must do" (Acts 9:6). When Paul was later recounting his conversion (Personal testimony?) he related what Ananias told him to do, "And now why are you waiting? Arise and be baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on the name of the Lord" (Acts 22:16). Ananias was sent by the Lord with this message (Acts 9:10-17). It was at the point of baptism that the blood of Christ washed away Paul's sins. Now consider what Paul...

PENNED. Paul's writings were inspired of God, and he himself recognized his writings as "The commandments of the Lord" (1

Corinthians 14:37). So we must take what he penned seriously. In 2 Timothy 2:10 Paul tells us that "Salvation" is "In Christ Jesus." This means that in order to receive salvation, one must get into Christ. How? Well, Paul's writings reveal this answer as well, "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ" (Galatians 3:27). How could it be any clearer? He also reminded the Romans that they were "Baptized into Christ Jesus" (Romans 6:3). Now consider what Paul...

PRESCRIBED. To prescribe is to stipulate action to be taken. Paul taught the same thing in every church, so he taught baptism as a necessity for salvation in every church as we have seen from the passages above. He sent Timothy to the Corinthians to remind them of his ways and teachings in Christ (1 Corinthians 4:17). Timothy was to commit to others the things Paul taught him (2 Timothy 2:1-2). Baptism then was included in the things Paul taught Timothy, and therefore Timothy was to include baptism for salvation as part of what he committed to others, which they were to then teach to others. All of this is in accordance with the message of the great commission, which included baptism (Mark 16:15-16).

DYING WELL

Many years ago my doctor made an interesting statement to me. He told me that over the years he had, sadly, witnessed many deaths. He said "Those who die in light of the Christian religion die in a much different way."

We will occasionally hear someone make the statement of one deceased, "He died well." What does it really mean to die well? Perhaps if one died in service to his country, he died well. Perhaps if someone gave his life to save another, he died well. Perhaps if someone died with little pain or suffering, he died well. In my estimation, none of these ways to die really captures the true idea of dying well.

The Bible says "*It is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment*" (Hebrews 9:27). Regardless of what it means to die well in the eyes of many, the bible teaches that the only way to truly die well is to die in Christ. Paul wrote, "*But I do not want you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning those who have fallen asleep, lest you sorrow as others who have no hope*" (1 Thessalonians 4:13). This verse alone teaches us that Christians do die much differently than those in the world. We die with hope! Our hope is that we will be in eternal glory when we pass from this life. In the context of the above passage, Paul is teaching that those who die in Christ have not ceased to exist; they will be glorified with Christ.

Death is always a sad occasion, but when the deceased is a child of God, that sadness is swallowed up in joy. For, "*Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on. Yes, says the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors, and their works follow them*" (Revelation 14:13). To die well means to die in Christ, in the Lord! Are you in Christ? Are you prepared to die well? (Galatians 3:26,27; Romans 6:1-6). 🔍
