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## THE TRUE VINE

Jesus is the true vine (John 15:1). He tells us about Himself as the true vine in relation to the branches – Christians. Let's learn from lessons from His teaching in John 15:1-8...

**Diligence In Our Work.** We were created in Christ Jesus for good works, and we are to be zealous for them (Ephesians 2:8-10; Titus 2:14). Jesus is clear that every branch in Him must bear fruit. There are many ways to bear fruit in the Lord, and every individual is different in relation to what he excels at. We can produce fruit from our lips through prayer. We can be fruitful in teaching the lost, in exhorting our brethren, in helping the less fortunate. Peter gives an excellent recipe as to how to be fruitful in 2 Peter 1:5-7. Virtue, knowledge, self-control, perseverance, godliness, brotherly kindness, and brotherly love all must added to our faith in order to prevent us from becoming barren. Peter even said "Giving all diligence," we must add these things to our faith (2 Peter 1:5). "By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit" (John 15:8).

**Denominationalism in the World.** Some have gone to John 15:1-8 in order to justify denominationalism.

They argue that Jesus is the True Vine and the branches constitute the various denominations. Jesus' use of personal pronouns throughout the context makes it clear that He has in mind individual disciples when He speaks of the branches. Those at Corinth sought to divide up into different sects, even to the point of naming themselves after certain men (1 Corinthians 1:12). Paul made it clear that such actions would divide the followers of Christ. He commanded them that they should all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among them (1 Corinthians 1:10).

**Departing From The Way.** Many religious leaders of our day argue that once one becomes a Christian he can never so sin as to lose his salvation. But Jesus makes it clear in this text that if one does not bear fruit, the Father will cut him off and cast him into the fire (John 15:2, 6). Peter emphasized that if one fails to add the virtues he listed, then that one would be "Barren" and "Unfruitful." He taught that if we wanted to make our calling and election sure, and have an entrance into heaven, then we must not become barren (2 Peter 1:8-11). One can certainly fall from grace (Galatians 5:4). 🔍

Love would not exist at all if it weren't for God, for God is love (1 John 4:8). We are not speaking in this short article of a mere emotion, but of true biblical love, active good will. We're speaking of action! If we are confused about who or what to love, let us be reminded of the following passages of scripture.

1. We are to love God (Matthew 22:37).

4. We are to love our neighbor (Matthew 22:39)
5. We are to love the Lord (1 John 5:1)
6. We are to love the Lord's appearing (2 Timothy 4:8)
7. We are to love our enemies (Matthew 5:43-44)
8. Men must love their wives (Ephesians 5:25)
9. Wives must love their husbands (Titus 2:4)
10. We must love our children (Titus 2:4)

Of course this is not an exhaustive list of what we are to love, but if everyone who claims to follow Christ would merely apply these, think of the positive changes that would take place in religion today! "Let all that you do be done with love" (1 Corinthians 16:14). 🔍
