

CLEANSING A LEPER Michael Pickford

Leprosy was around long before the was there during His time. In Mark 1:40-45(and Luke 5:12-14) we read a beautiful story about how our Lord cleansed a man of this dreaded, deadly disease. Let's consider three teaching points from this story...

The Lord's Compassion. The leper came to Jesus imploring Him to heal him. Mark tells us that Jesus was "Moved with compassion" (Mark 1:41). Jesus was often moved with compassion over the plight of the people around Him. Significantly, He was moved with compassion over the lost condition of the crowd (Matthew 9:35-38). He told His disciples to pray that the Lord would send laborers into the field. God is not willing that any perish, but desires that all come to a knowledge of the truth and be saved (2 Peter 3:9; 1 Timothy 2:3-4). Like Jesus, we must harbor in our hearts a deep compassion and concern for the sick, the hungry, the naked, the imprisoned, etc. Our actions or inaction towards those less fortunate will be a significant determinant as to where we will spend eternity, whether it be eternal life or eternal punishment (Matthew 25:35-46).

The Lord's Cleansing. Leprosy Lord walked the earth as a man, but it was a highly contagious, often deadly disease. When one suffered from it, not only was he dying painfully, but he was also a social outcast, one who was required to keep his hair unkempt, cover the lower part of his face, and scream out "Unclean" whenever people were near. Jesus did the unthinkable; He reached out and touched this leper! Hopelessness is a given with leprosy. Many feel hopeless in their sin; But the Lord will forgive the vilest of sinners (1 Corinthians 6:9-11). No one has been so sinful that he cannot come to Christ. Jesus cleansed the leper with His touch, He will cleanse our sin with His blood when we obey (Heb. 5:8-9; 1 Pt. 1:19; Eph. 1:7; Revelation 1:5). Baptism is clearly the point at which the blood of Christ touches our sins and cleanses them (Acts 22:16: Mark 16:16).

The Lord's Command. Jesus "Strictly warned" the leper to tell no one what He had done for Him. Yet the leper went out and told everyone (Mark 1:45). It's ironic, Jesus cleansed the leper from his leprosy and commanded him to tell no one, yet he told everyone. Jesus cleansed us from our sin and commanded us to tell everyone, and we often tell no one. Heed Mark 16:15! \sim
