"Let the redeemed of the Lord say so, whom He has redeemed from the hand of the enemy" (Psalm 107:2).

A FRIEND'S FAITHFUL WOUNDS **Michael Pickford**

"Faithful are the wounds of a friend" (Proverbs 27:6). This statement was made following these words, "Open rebuke is better than love carefully concealed" (Proverbs 27:5). meaning of some of the Proverbs does not immediately leap to the mind, but we're all too familiar with the concept of rebuke. We don't like it. We don't like having to rebuke others and we certainly don't like being on the receiving end. Let's consider Three reactions one might have to a rebuke...

Grudge. When one is rebuked, he tends to have a feeling of ill will or resentment towards the one rebuking hm. Even when the rebuke is uncalled for, or unjustified, we must strive to avoid this reaction. But often, this ill will comes because we know we are guilty, and when the rebuke comes, instead of being repentant, we rage. We then compound our sin by saying things we should not; things that are unkind and mean spirited. Remember, even when being rebuked, we must be kind, tenderhearted, forgiving one another (Ephesians 5:32).

Guilt. Often, the feelings of ill will towards the one rebuking us arise because we know we are guilty. Someone has noticed something we

have said or done, so we've been caught. We thought we got away with it, foolishly forgetting that our sin will find us out (Numbers 32:23). When being rebuked, we must evaluate ourselves honestly (2 Corinthians 13:5). We need to be sorrowful and ashamed that someone else has been hurt by our sin. We need to allow that guilt, that sorrow, to produce repentance within us (2 Corinthians 7:9-10).

Gratitude. It's an overlooked blessing when someone cares enough about us and our soul to drum up the courage to confront us about our sin. It's not easy to rebuke someone who has sinned. We should be thankful first that they care about keeping the Lord's command to rebuke someone who has sinned (Luke 17:3). We should be even more thankful that someone cared enough about us to rebuke us. They could have just coward down like so many do, ignored our sin, become tolerant, and allowed us to go on and lose our soul. Nathan expressed love towards David when he rebuked him for his adultery with Bathsheba. wounds of a friend are faithful. It is the enemy who overlooks your sins and instead only compliments you on the good things. \nearrow
