

leading cause of death in America. It is very important to protect the condition of your heart. This can be challenging, but worth the effort. More importantly, spiritual heart disease results in eternal condemnation. The heart is used metaphorically many times in the Bible. Let's learn some lessons...

A Corrupt Heart. Jesus placed His blessing upon the one with a "Pure Heart" (Matthew 5:8). This is a sincere heart that loves God. It's a heart that's free from corrupt thoughts of lust, strife, slander, hatred, covetousness, deceit, pride, etc. (Mark 7:21-23). If we're not very protective of our spiritual heart, it can easily be corrupted by the wicked society in which we live. We must be careful about the influences that surround us. lest we find ourselves living and acting like the world (Romans 12:1-2). The way we entertain ourselves, the places we go, the things we say, the way we act and react in certain situations, these are all different than the world.

A Calloused Heart. Hardening of the arteries is associated with heart disease. We must be careful of our spiritual hearts, lest they become

Heart disease continues to be the hardened. It's easy to become desensitized to the evil that surrounds us. We no longer cringe when we read that horrific news story about rape, murder, or abortion. We must also keep our hearts tender for the truth of God's word, lest we be deceived. The Bible speaks of those who are "Past feeling." (Ephesians 4:19). Some have had their consciences seared by error. We need to keep ourselves simple (Innocent) concerning evil (Romans 16:19).

A Concealed Heart. Many have become very adroit at keeping evil secrets. They conceal, or hide their sin in their hearts. We may succeed at keeping our secrets from the preacher, the elders, the church, our friends and family, even our spouse; but God knows the deepest corners of our hearts. He can see it all. It's lain out bare before His all seeing eyes (Hebrews 4:12-13). On the last day He will judge the secrets of man through Christ (Romans 2:16). "He who covers his sins will not prosper, but whoever confesses and forsakes them will have mercy" (Proverbs 28:13). "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your sight, O Lord, my strength and my redeemer" (Psalm 19:14). 🔑

REFUSING TO DO EVIL

Serving God is not just about choosing to do the right things, and to be busy with good works that serve and help others and glorify God. Certainly we must be "Zealous for good works," as we were "Created in Christ Jesus for them" (Titus 2:14; Ephesians 2:10). We sometimes think we can continue to do bad things and then "Make it right" by doing a good thing; balance the books. But faithfully serving the Lord isn't just about doing good things; it's very much about refusing to do evil things.

We are often faced with the opportunity to do something wicked and sinful. When "Sin comes a knocking," how do we respond? There are some who "Refuse to do justice" (Proverbs 21:7). We must refuse to do evil.

Joseph Refused To Do Evil. What an example we have in Joseph! For a good while it seemed every time he turned around he was being done wrong. One time was in Egypt. His master loved him, but his master's wife lusted after him. She repeatedly tempted him to commit adultery with her, and he flat out refused her repeatedly. I love his words, "How then can I do this great wickedness, and sin against God" (Genesis 39:9). We should have these words seared in our hearts when tempted to do what's wrong.

Job refused to speak evil against God. Job was certainly in a position to give in and commit evil with his lips and curse God. Even his wife told him, "Curse God and die!" (Job 2:9). But he refused to do so! He reminded her that God had given them a great deal of good things in life, and should they turn their back on Him when bad things happened? Job refused to "Sin with his lips" (Job 2:10). How often have we been tempted to accuse God for the bad things that happen in life? Don't do it! Follow Job's example.

Yes we must abound in good works (1 Corinthians 15:58). But in doing this, let's also have the courage to refuse to do evil, to "Abhor what is evil" (Romans 12:9).. Let's pray for the strength to "Fear the Lord and depart from evil" (Proverbs 3:7).
