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GROWING WEARY WHILE DOING GOOD Michael Pickford

I have written and preached on Galatians 6:9 before, pointing out some of the good things people can grow weary of doing. In this article, let's consider some reasons why one might grow weary of doing good....

A Lack of Recognition. Some might grow weary of doing good because they are not praised, or even thanked. Certainly folks should express their gratefulness when someone does them a kindness, but if they don't thank us, we should continue to help them in their need. Some stop doing good because of a lack of praise from others. They want their generosity broadcasted and praised. They post their acts of kindness on Facebook, or brag about them (with feigned humility) to friends and neighbors, in hopes of getting those compliments. Those who do such are not unlike the Hypocritical Pharisees whom the Lord condemned, "Therefore, when you do a charitable deed, do not sound a trumpet before you as the hypocrites do..." (Matthew 6:2). "But all their works they do to be seen by men" (Matthew 23:5).

A Lack of Reciprocation. Some will stop doing good for others because those they help don't turn around and help them when they have need. They do not reciprocate. Certainly they are in the wrong for this, but this does not justify our ceasing to help others. In doing a good deed, we should not do so with a "What's in it for me" approach. Our motive should simply be love and concern. We should help others even if there is no foreseeable way of them ever helping us. Paul taught that we could sell everything we have and give it to the poor, but if we do so without the motive of love, it profits us nothing (1 Corinthians 13:3).

A Lack of Resources. While it is true that those who have wealth also possess greater responsibility and resources to help those in need (1 Timothy 6:17-19), the Bible speaks of some who gave generously even though they themselves were suffering poverty. "Their deep poverty abounded in the riches of their liberality" (2 Corinthians 8:2). How dare we, even when we're struggling financially, refrain from helping others when we have a house full of TVs and video games, a driveway occupied by two vehicles, and a cupboard full of groceries! We need to trust God that He will supply all of our needs (Philippians 4:19).

Let us not, for any reason, grow weary in doing good.

As a father of two daughters, it seems the question I hear most in regards to them is: where are they going to college? While stating that there is nothing wrong with college at all, I can tell you as a father, that question is not, and will not ever be paramount in my mind.

First and foremost, my wife and I are raising our daughters (and our sons) to be followers of God first. We hope and pray they will grow and mature to become great Christians.
