## Don'T BE OVERLY RIGHTEOUS Michael Pickford

Is it possible to be too righteous? Solomon made a curious statement in Ecclesiastes 7:16, "Do not be overly righteous..." What can he mean? Let's consider some possibilities...

Is he saying that we should not strive to be too good? Should we reach a certain level of spirituality and holiness, and then put on the breaks? Surely not! The Bible is clear that God wants us to keep growing until we die. God wants us to pursue holiness and righteousness, not shrink away from overdoing it; and He wanted this in Old Testament times too. God said, "Be holy, for I am holy" (Lev. 12:44; 1 Pt. 1:16). That's a high standard! (Ephesians 5:1).

One possibility is that Solomon is warning against self righteousness. This is certainly worth considering. The Pharisees of Jesus' day were certainly guilty of this and the Lord rebuked them for it often. He even spoke a parable in order to highlight this fault in them. In Luke 18:9-14 we read of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector, who both went to pray. The Pharisee, in his self righteousness, basically bragged to God about how righteous he was. He did not go down justified. The Tax Collector's humility got his prayers heard (1 Pt 5:5-6; Jms 4:10).

Solomon may have in mind the type of righteousness as defined by man rather than by God. God tells us how to be righteous in His word, but that isn't good enough for some, and they begin to create rules and laws on their own, seeking to establish their own righteousness, rather than God's (Rom 10:3). The Pharisees were guilty of this as well. They had developed hundreds of rigid, man-made laws and insisted they be kept (Mt 23:4)! Let us be content to serve God as He has directed in His word. Nothing more, nothing less!  $\sim$



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### A GREAT THINKER Michael Pickford

Many have made their mark as great thinkers. Epicurus, Zeno, Confucius, these were considered great thinkers. But God has told us exactly how to be great thinkers in Philippians 4:8, where Paul listed things we must "Think on. It's one thing to be considered and honored as a great thinker in philosophy, medicine, science, or mathematics, and these fields of interest have significant impacts on our lives while on this earth, but the things Paul told us to think on impact our eternal life in heaven. It's much better to have God regard us as great thinkers than men. **Whatever Things Are True.** Rather than getting absorbed in a society obsessed with falsehoods, let's think and speak the truth. Let's be "Honest."

Whatever Things Are Noble (Honest). We should provide honorable things in the sight of the Lord and of men (2 Corinthians 8:21). Gossip, slander, complaining, etc. are not honorable. Let's be praising, encouraging, and content people of God.. Whatever Things Are Just. We must imitate God's just nature (Eph 5:1), rather than thinking about how to swindle our fellow man. If we want to attain to our eternal inheritance, we must "Follow what is altogether just" (Deut 16:20). Whatever Things Are Pure. Via internet, TV, movies, commercials, books, games, apps, and magazines, we are inundated with temptations to defile ourselves. We must take our eyes and hearts away from the filth around us, and be pure in heart, if we would see God (Mtt 5:8).

Whatever Things Are Lovely. We worry ourselves into a fit thinking about violence, disease, and tragedies. God has surrounded us with lovely things to reflect on. There's His creation around us, and especially our rich blessings in Christ.
Whatever Things Are of Good Report. Too many get delight out of tasty bits of gossip. "The words of a talebearer are like tasty trifles, And they go down into the inmost body" (Proverbs 26:22). Remember, Love does not rejoice in iniquity, but in the truth (1 Cor. 13:6). Let's put off backbiting, gossip, and slander, our fill our minds with thoughts of good news and joyous things (Eph 4:31; 3 Jn 1:3-4).
Whatever Things Are Virtuous. Satan would rob us of excellent thoughts and virtuous principles. Let's not allow him! Read God's word daily to keep your mid

Find redemption now (in faith) instead of waiting too late to make the great confession. Obey His gospel. "He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned" (Mark 16:16). Bow your knee now for salvation, instead of waiting till then in condemnation. -
