Friends, teachers, and even family members forsake us when times are rough, or through impatience with our weaknesses and idiosyncrasies. What do we do? Turn to the Lord!!!

COMING UP SHORT Michael Pickford

When something comes up short, this means it is deficient, insufficient to meet the goal or need. It doesn't meet up to the acceptable standard. We might come up short in many things, but in the area of spirituality and serving God, coming up short is eternally deadly. The Bible says we can "Fall short" of God's grace, God's glory, and our eternal rest (Heb 12:15; Rom 3:23; Heb 4:1). We must identify the causes of our shortcomings, and determine how to defeat them.

We Must Fear. Fear can keep of from falling short of our reward (Heb 4:1). Those who in their "bravado" declare, "I ain't scared of anything," are foolish. Healthy fear protects us from danger. If we do not fear and respect lightning for what it can do, we can lose our lives. If we do not fear and respect hell, we can lose our souls. If we don't fear and respect God, we will be denied eternal rest.

We Must Look Carefully. (Heb 12:15). We must keep a watchful eye on God's word lest we fall short of God's grace. We must look often inwardly at our own selves to make sure we are living up to His standards. Staying focused on God's word and will prevents our eyes from being distracted by man's doctrines and traditions (Gal 5:4).

We Must Feed Our Faith. A lack of studying and applying God's word renders a weak faith, which causes folks to come up short spiritually (Heb 4:1-2). Faith comes by hearing God's word, and it keeps coming and growing in the same way. Neglecting daily bible study and the meetings of the church will destroy our relationship with God and His people.

We Must Avoid Covetousness. If we keep our minds and aspirations on the almighty dollar, then we will fall short in our service to the Almighty God (Matt 19:22-23). We cannot serve God and mammon (Matt 6:24). Many neglect critical spiritual duties because they are too busy trying to make more money.

We Must Defeat Temptation. We are all tempted. Even the Lord was not exempt. But we must learn to overcome and avoid sin. Sin causes one to fall short of God's glory (Rom 3:23). Most are able to defeat temptation in relation to the "Big sins." But all sin is big in God's eyes. Many of us struggle with our own "Little" sins; those that easily ensnare us (Heb 12:1). We must lay them aside. We must examine ourselves, identify them, and eradicate them from our lives, or we will fall short of God's glory (2 Cor 13:5).

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FELLOWSHIPPING OR COMBATING ERROR? Joe R. Price

J. W. McGarvey is recognized as one of the outstanding Bible scholars of the restoration movement of the 1800's. He was in the prime of his life (1829-1912) when the controversy over the use of instrumental music in church worship divided brethren in this country. While McGarvey personally opposed instrumental music in church worship, history tells us that he tried to combat it by tolerating its practice. Nearing the end of his life, he gave the following assessment of this approach to dealing with error among brethren to a young preacher. It is worth repeating:

"You are on the right road, and whatever you do, don't let anyone persuade you that you can successfully combat error by fellowshipping it and going along with it. I have tried. I believed at the start that was the only way to do it. I've never held membership in a congregation that used instrumental music. I have, however, accepted invitations to preach without distinctions between churches that used it and churches that didn't. I've gone along with their papers and magazines and things of that sort. During all these years I have taught the truth as the New Testament teaches it to every young preacher who passed through the College of the Bible. Yet, I do not know of more than six of them who are preaching the truth today. It won't work."

The New Testament also teaches us "it won't work." Accommodation with error does not promote unity (Eph. 4:3-6). It promotes compromise, corrupting those who attempt to fellowship error (2 Cor. 6:14-18; 11:2-4). It produces the loss of fellowship with God as it causes one to partake in error (2 Jn. 9-11). Yet, brethren still try to use this approach with error today - the social gospel, divorce and remarriage, evolution, denominationalism and many more. It won't work today, either. Do not bury your head in the sand! Error will not go away! It must be opposed for the sake of truth and the salvation of our souls (Jude 3-4; Gal. 2:4-5)! -
