8:24; Mark 16:16). But other passages teach us that one must repent of his sins (Luke 13:3; Acts 2:38; Acts 17:30). Other passages tell us that salvation comes by a confession of faith (Romans 10:9-10; Acts 8:37). And still many other passages say that salvation comes through baptism (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38; 1 Peter 3:21; Acts 22:16, etc.)

The clear conclusion is that there is no one verse that gives us the entire picture of man's responsibilities when it comes to securing his salvation. To claim that "Any verse that ascribes salvation to faith/belief, with no other requirement mentioned, is a declaration that salvation is by faith alone" is to make a careless and negligent claim. It also forces a contradiction with other passages of scripture that do require other things one must do in order to be saved.

Incidentally, Hebrews 5:8-9 and 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9 clearly, in no uncertain terms, require "obedience" in order to obtain salvation. Obedience only salvation? To the exclusion of faith? Hmmm

SALVATION BY FAITH ALONE? Michael Pickford

I recently read an article on a popular religious website called "<u>Gotquestions.org.</u>" The article deals with James 2:24 and seeks to explain the phrase "Faith alone" in that passage. The article then goes about trying to explain why James 2:24 doesn't mean what it says, and why "Not by faith alone" doesn't really mean "Not by faith alone." Hmmm. I'm not meaning to deal with every aspect of the article in this post, but I do want to focus in on one statement they made which caught my eye. Here's the quote,"

"Any verse that ascribes salvation to faith/belief, with no other requirement mentioned, is a declaration that salvation is by faith alone."

Really? Let's apply this reasoning to things other than faith. For example, Jesus stated in Luke 13:3, "I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish." Now, I think we would agree that if one is not going to "perish," then he is saved. Jesus stated that if one repents he will not perish. So, if one repents he will be saved. However, repentance is the only act he mentions in this verse. He even reiterates it in verse 5. There's no mention of faith, confession, baptism. Nothing! So, following the reasoning put forth in the aforementioned article above, we should conclude that we are saved by Repentance alone?! To put it more in line with what they have stated. Luke 13:3 requires repentance, with no other requirement mentioned, so by their reasoning, this must be a declaration that salvation is by repentance alone.

"But wait," they would say. "We know salvation is not by repentance alone because there are other verses that require faith." Exactly! Now they're coming around to a proper mode of reasoning when it comes to God's revelation. If Luke 13:3 doesn't teach salvation by repentance alone because other passages require other things, then John 3:16 doesn't teach salvation by faith alone because other passages require other things.

In fact, the Bible says that one must first hear the Gospel (Romans 10:17). One must then believe what they have been taught, that Jesus is the son of God (John
