I never noticed the connection between Gabriel's statement to Mary and how we become sons of God:

Luke 1:35 And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God.

John 1:12-13 But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

John 3:3-6 Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." ... Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit Galatians 3:26-27 for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ.

Daily Bible Study by Michael Pickford

This Week's Theme: Mind Your Eyes

Weekly Memory Verse: Job 31:1

Introduction: If we have vision, it's because God has blessed us with it, However, God expects us to be responsible with our eyes. There are many things in this world that we should strive to avoid with our eyes, and, there are many things that we must look upon regularly; God's word, for example, "Open my eyes, that I may see Wondrous things from your law" (Psalm 119:18). We should use our eyes to read and study God's word on a daily basis (Acts 17:11). This week, let's spend some time each day considering some responsible and irresponsible uses of our eyes.

Monday: Beware of the lust of the eyes.

- 1. Job 31:1: Was Job speaking here of merely looking at a woman? What type of looking do you think he had in mind?
- 2. Matthew 5:27-30: Is it ok to lust after a woman as long as you don't follow through with the lust? Can you think of some avenues by which Satan tempts us in this regard today?
- 3. 1 John 2:16, 17: The lust of the eyes is not of Whom? In verse 17, what two things are said to be passing away?

Tuesday: Beware of the green-eyed monster of envy.

- 1. Define envy:
- 2. 1 Samuel 18:6-11: What does it mean that Saul "eyed" David? What did this lead Saul to want to do to David?
- 3. Mark 15:10: According to this passage, why did the Jews hand Jesus over to be crucified?
- 4. 1 Corinthians 13:4: Love does not do what? Can you think of some ways that Christians today might become guilty of envy?

Wednesday: Beware of the Covetous eye.

- 1. Matthew 6:19-24: the "Bad" or "Unhealthy" eye, spiritually speaking, leads to spiritually distorted vision in which we see temporary material things as more valuable than eternal spiritual things. Where did Jesus say we must lay up our treasures? What did Jesus say it was impossible to do?
- 2. 1 Timothy 6:6-10: What did Paul offer as the cure for covetousness?

Thursday: Be careful with your entertainment.

1. Psalm 101:3-4: What would David not set before his eyes? What did he hate? By contrast, do we love certain TV programs and movies that contain wicked things? Read verse 4 again. What can viewing these things on a regular basis lead to?

- 2. Romans 12:9: How might this verse apply to the things we chose to entertain ourselves with?
- 3. Proverbs 4:23: The idea behind the "keep" here is to "Guard." How could this apply to our entertainment choices?

Friday: Set your eyes on heaven.

- 1. Colossians 3:1-3: What should we seek? Where should our minds be set?
- 2. Staying focused on our heavenly home can prompt us to do many things. List some of these things from the following verses:
 - a. Revelation 14:13
 - b. 2 Corinthians 4:16-18
- 3. Which of these things can we do in order to help keep our eyes focused on heaven?:
 - a. Read the Bible daily (Acts 17:11)
 - b. Pray regularly (1 Thessalonians 5:17)
 - c. Attend worship services (Hebrews 10:25)
 - d. Serve others (Galatians 6:9-10)
 - e. All of the above.
