Bible Memorials

Several holidays in the United States are designed to act as memorials. Strewn across the landscape of this country are statues and plaques acting as memorials to great heroes of the past and momentous moments. These memorials are intended to remind someone of some type of significant event in history, and to recall the lessons learned. The memorials in the Bible are no different. Consider these.

- 1) The Twelve Rocks Memorial. Upon crossing the Jordan River to possess the Promised Land, Joshua instructed a memorial of stones be erected, "That the waters of Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the LORD; when it passed over Jordan, the waters of Jordan were cut off: and these stones shall be for a memorial unto the children of Israel for ever" (Josh. 4:7). Any time children asked about these rocks, they were reminded of God's deliverance of the Promised Land.
- 2) The Passover Memorial. The last of the ten Memorial. The last of the Ten Plagues was the death of the first-born. Yet, God protected His people, and the Passover became a memorial, "And this day shall be unto you for a memorial; and ye shall keep it a feast to the LORD throughout your generations; ye shall keep it a feast by an ordinance for ever" (Exo. 12:14). It reminded God's people of His love.
- 3) The Rainbow Memorial. God had tired of the people on earth. Their thoughts were evil "continually" (Gen. 6:5). God devised a plan to eradicate the earth of the sinful people through a flood. He saved mankind through Noah and his family. Following the flood, God made a promise, "I do set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be for a token of a covenant between me and the earth" (Gen. 9:13). Every time we see a rainbow today, it is a memorial to us that God will never do such a thing with water again.
- 4) The Lord's Supper Memorial. Jesus endured a cruel, painful, and pitiless death. His blood "purchased the church" (Acts 20:28). His death made it possible that we might live. He deserves us remembering Him for what He did on the cross. Paul wrote "Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me" AND "This cup is the new testament church" (Acts 20:28). His death made it possible that we might live. Paul said it well, "in him we live, and move, and have our being" (Acts 17:28). He deserves us remembering Him for what He did on the cross. Paul wrote "Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me" and "This cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me" (I Cor. 11:24-25). This is the greatest memorial of all time. It commemorates the single greatest act of love and devotion of all time. Paul penned, "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8). This is why we, every first day of the week, partake of the Lord's Supper (Acts 20:7).

Let us always be mindful of how God makes ways for us in difficult times, how He provides deliverance, how He keeps His promises and how immensely He loved us as manifested by the gift of His only Begotten Son!
