

A Great Thinker

Many have stood out as great thinkers. Epicurus, Zeno, and Confucius are notable examples. But a child of God should be a great thinker.

The Holy Spirit through Paul told us how to be great thinkers. "Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things" (Philippians 4:8-KJV). "Think on these things."

It's great to be honored as a great thinker in philosophy, medicine, science, or mathematics. These fields of interest significantly impact our lives on this earth. But the things Paul told us to think on significantly impact our prospect of eternal life in heaven.

Consider the items on Paul's list. "True." Rather than getting absorbed in a society obsessed with falsehoods, let's think and speak the truth. Let's be "Honest" and up front rather than sneaky and underhanded. We must be fair and "just" people, and "pure" while living among temptations to defile ourselves. Adam

THE ENTIRE HUMAN RACE began with one man – Adam. Let's learn some important lessons from him.

Adam Was Created. The first man did not come along because of billions of years of evolution. God created him as a whole man. "Then God said, 'Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness..." (Genesis 1:26). "For in the image of God He made man" (Genesis 8:6). Man was created in "The image and glory of God" (1 Corinthians 11:7) and "In the similitude of God" (James 3:9). "Similitude" means "Likeness." If we were made in God's likeness, we should certainly strive to be like Him. We should strive to avoid fleshly lusts and "Be imitators of God as dear children" (Ephesians 5:1-7).

Adam Was Cared For. God was concerned about Adam and cared for him in many ways. "The Lord God planted a garden eastward in Eden, and there He put the man whom He had formed" (Genesis 2:8). The verses that follow explain the beautiful aspects of this garden, including the tree of life, and Adam was blessed with the privilege of tending it and living in and of it (Genesis 2:15). Spiritually, God "Created" us "in Christ Jesus for good works" (Ephesians 2:10). Adam was commanded to "Be fruitful and multiply" in order to "Fill the earth" (Genesis 2:28). We are commanded to preach the Gospel to "Every Creature," "To the end of the earth" (Mark 16:15; Acts 1:8). If Adam did as he was told, he would enjoy life everlasting in the beautiful garden of paradise as he would have continuous access to the "Tree of life" (Genesis 2:9; 3:22). If we keep the Lord's commandments, we are promised eternal life in heaven (Matthew 25:46; 1 Peter 1:3-5).

Adam Was Chastised. God commanded Adam not to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (Genesis 2:16). He specified the punishment – death (vs 17). Adam disobeyed and ate of that tree and as a result was expelled from beautiful Eden and denied access to the tree of life (Genesis 3:6, 22-24). Adam was blessed with more than he could ever dream of, yet he had to have the one thing that was off limits. God has blessed us richly in Christ (Ephesians 1:3). Let's be satisfied with His blessings and avoid the forbidden fruit of sinful behavior. Let's strive for our tree of life by faithfully keeping His commandments (Revelation 22:14).
