

Guarding The Supplies

AN OLDER SISTER IN the nursing home told me, "I feel so helpless to the church being bedridden in this place" (paraphrased). I told her that she could do one of the greatest works of all. Pray!

She could not assemble with the saints, but she could pray for those assembling. She could not drum up Bible studies with the lost, but she could pray for those of us who could. She could not visit the sick or feed the hungry. There was very little that she could physically do. But she could guard the supplies for the soldiers!

Huh? Well, there's a wonderful story buried in the thirtieth chapter of 1 Samuel about David avenging Ziklag which had been invaded and burned by the Amalekites. All its inhabitants were carried away captive. David and his six hundred men pursued the invaders, and being led by a young Egyptian, they found them, overtook them, and rescued all the captives.

But on their way to the battle, two hundred of David's men were too exhausted to carry on, so they stayed behind to guard the supplies. After the battle, those who fought did not want to share the spoils with them. But David gave credit to God for the victory, and then said, "But as his part is who goes down to battle, so shall his part be who stays by the supplies; they shall share alike" (1 Samuel 30:24).

God expects us to do what we can with what we've got. Even if it's merely guarding the supplies. Don't get discouraged if in your mind you don't measure up to other soldiers in the kingdom. In fact, if all you can do is pray... then pray! It moves mountains for the cause of the Lord.

Godly Speech

There are all types of speech and various languages across the world and across our nation. Each language has its own dialect depending on what part of the country one lives in. Language sets people apart from one another, and accents can give away where one is from. To a trained ear, one can tell what State, or even what part of a State you are a citizen in. Should the Christian's language give him away? Philippians 3:20 tells us that we are citizens of heaven. Should our language not reflect our citizenship? Absolutely! Our language should let people know that we are citizens of heaven; that we are Christians; that we are the people of God. Godly Speech is that which is...

Seasoned With Salt. "Walk in wisdom toward those who are outside, redeeming the time. Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one" (Colossians 4:5-6). Speech that is seasoned with salt is gracious; not mean-spirited, rude, or even cruel. Salt seasoned speech is also good; not filthy, lewd, or impure (Colossians 3:8). It is also genuine. Christians should be known as people who speak the truth. Their words are honest and dependable. "Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds" (Colossians 3:9). Salted speech is also glad. Let the world do the complaining and let the Christian rejoice! (Philippians 4:4).

<u>Sanctified For Service</u>. Our speech should not be like the world's, it should be set apart, holy, ready to glorify God. Our prayer lives should be active (1 Thessalonians 5:17). We should be speaking the Gospel to our friends, neighbors; etc (Acts 8:4). We should be ready to use our mouths to worship God (Ephesians 5:19; Hebrews 10:25).

Scary To Satan. In the latter part of his famous poem about prayer Cowper wrote, "Restraining prayer we cease to fight, prayer makes the Christian's armor bright; And Satan trembles when he sees the weakest saint upon his knees." It's true; Satan does not want us praying. If you want to defeat the master of evil you must have an active, devoted prayer life. Many passages urge us to pray regularly about all things (Ephesians 6:18, etc.). Someone has said, "When Satan knocks you to your knees; he has put you in a perfect position to pray!" But you need to pray before he gets you there! Prayer is an essential part of Godly Speech.
