What about Christians? We are God's "workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works" (Eph. 2:10). God created us in Christ Jesus for a purpose. If we have able bodies but are not busy doing the works He created us to do, we are useless to Him.

Even those without able bodies can do one of the greatest works of all: Pray!

We bear fruit in Christ by doing good works. Peter said we prevent becoming fruitless by adding to our faith virtue, knowledge, self-control, perseverance, godliness, brotherly kindness and love (2 Peter 1:5-7). These things take work and adding them causes us to function as God intended. Without them, we are barren and unfruitful (2 Peter 1:8). What does God do with the fruitless? They are cut off and cast into the fire (Jn. 15:1-8). If we think we can fly into heaven on the wings of indifference and inactivity, it doesn't work! 🔍

DO NOT BE DECEIVED!

Paul wrote in 2 Timothy 3:13, "But evil men and impostors will grow worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived." The declining moral nature of our society should cause all of us much alarm. It is imperative that we do not let our adversary, the devil, deceive us regarding sin.

Alcohol. "Wine is a mocker, strong drink is raging: and whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise" (Proverbs 20:1). Most Christians recognize drunkenness as a work of the flesh (Galatians 5:21), and that drunkards will not inherit the kingdom of God (1 Corinthians 6:9-10). But Satan attempts to deceive us by trying to get us to reason in such a way as to justify one drink, or even social drinking. Interestingly, Peter used three Greek words which condemn all stages of drinking, from that first drink to the "Slobbering drunk" state (1 Peter 4:3).

Associations. "Do not be deceived: Evil company corrupts good habits" (1 Corinthians 15:33). We must live in the wicked world around us without allowing it to influence us to evil (1 Cor. 5:9-10; Rom. 12:1-2). Even though we must go to school with, work with, and shop with the wicked people of

the world, we must be careful about our friendships with them. While we should seek some level of friendship with them in order to influence and teach them for good, we cannot be around them while they are partaking in their evil deeds. We don't watch the ball game with them while they're drinking. We don't drive them around while they are drinking. We don't listen to and laugh at their lewd jokes and comments. Some think they can handle it, that they won't be influenced. Don't be deceived!

Accountability. "Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap" (Galatians 6:7)." Often, there are severe earthly consequences for the sins men commit. But often, men think they are getting away with their sins because there seems to be no earthly consequences. Sometimes men take their secrets to the grave. But do not be deceived, you have not escaped accountability for your sins. "Some men's sins are clearly evident, preceding them to judgment, but those of some men follow later" (1 Timothy 5:24). Repent before it's too late. Don't think God will not punish you for the sins you keep hidden from others. God sees all (Proverbs 15:3). 🔍

GOVERNMENT

“Let every soul be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God” (Romans 13:1). To this Peter adds, “Therefore submit yourselves to every ordinance of man for the Lord’s sake...” (1 Pet. 2:13-15a).

As children of God, we are to obey the laws of the land. Some want to ignore certain laws, dismissing them as silly; but in order to be faithful to God we must submit to them. There are some who ignore stop signs, exceed the speed limit, or decline to pay certain taxes simply because they see no use for them. It is not ours to question; we are to obey the laws, and those who do not will have to answer for it.

Some suggest that because our government is “evil” we are therefore exempt from submitting. Nothing could be further from the truth. When Peter and Paul wrote the above words, a very wicked government ruled, one that encouraged idolatry. Nevertheless, God said to submit. I would dare say that in relation to the

Roman government of the first century our government is rather fair and sane.

But what if the government requires me to do something that God would not want me to do? Or what if the government decrees that I refrain from doing something God has commanded me to do? God allows for these instances. John and Peter were arrested for preaching the Gospel. They were commanded not to speak in the name of Jesus again. They answered, “Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you more than to God, you judge” (Acts 4:19). Peter later said, “We ought to obey God rather than men” (Acts 5:29). We should always obey our government whenever their laws do not conflict with the commandments of God. Even if some of them conflict with God’s commands, we must still obey those that don’t.

The government derives its authority from God. As such, we must obey the laws of the land no matter how silly they may sometimes seem to us. We are exempt from obeying only those laws which contradict God’s will. 🔍
