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IN THE WORKPLACE

The Bible gives us wise instruction regarding any type of relationship we may experience in life. The principles given in the New Testament to guide the Master/Slave apply appropriately to the Employer/Employee relationships of our day. In the workplace, a Christian must be...

Devoted. Any employer will tell you that loyalty and dependability is difficult to find in employees. If I am an employee, God calls upon me to be devoted. *“Exhort bondservants to be obedient to their own masters, to be well pleasing in all things, not answering back, not pilfering, but showing all good fidelity, that they may adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in all things”* (Titus 2:9-10). By always calling in late, or calling in “Sick” often, or pilfering some of the product, or back-talking and lounging around, many employees are regarded by their boss and co-workers as anything but devoted. Honesty, dependability and obedience in the work place will adorn the Gospel of God and bring a good name on the church we attend (Titus 2:10).

Diligent. In the workplace, there’s nothing more frustrating than a lazy employee. A Christian should be

diligent while on the job lest he blaspheme the name of God (1 Timothy 6:1). Some employees stay busy while the boss is in the room, but when the boss is away they play, stand around idle, disrupt the other workers, “Goof off,” etc. Paul said our work should be *“Not with eyeservice, as menpleasers, but in sincerity of heart, fearing God”* (Colossians 3:22). Even though the boss isn’t in the room, the Lord is; we should work as if He is our boss. Diligence is a shining characteristic in every relationship. Not only should an employee be dependable and trustworthy, he needs to be a hard worker. *“Whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to men”* (Colossians 3:23).

Delighted. If we’re blessed with a job, we should not be grumbling complainers. From the hours, to the working conditions, to the rate of pay, some employees are known to complain about almost everything. We should be delighted to have employment. Our work should be accomplished *“With goodwill doing service, as to the Lord, and not to men”* (Ephesians 6:7); *“Knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance;”* (Colossians 3:24).

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WHAT IS "LENT"?

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, Lent is a 40 day period of fasting (Sundays not included) proceeding "Easter." It is common for an officiant in the church to place a cross-shaped mixture of ashes and oil (sometimes Holy Water is used) on the forehead of church members where it often remains throughout the entirety of Ash Wednesday.

The Lenten season began around 1000 AD in the Catholic Church but many protestant denominations have also taken up the practice (Consider Matthew 15:8-9). The Bible says nothing about "Ash Wednesday" or the "Lenten season." "Whoever transgresses and does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God..." (2 John 9). We are only to practice those things which are authorized in Christ's doctrine (Colossians 3:17; 1 Peter 4:11, etc). Churches practicing Ash Wednesday and the Lenten season are in violation of the doctrine of Christ.

It is common for those who observe the Lenten season to "give up" something for the 40 days (40 days taken from Jesus' 40 day fast in the wilderness). Things known to be given up by folks during this time include cigarettes, drinking, foul language, gambling, fornication, and

dance clubbing. Remember, this is a commitment to give these things up only during the forty days of Lent. But the Bible calls upon Christians to give up sinful things forever! Many of these things are works of the flesh which will bar one from the kingdom of heaven (Galatians 5:19-21). Do they really think God is pleased if they only commit to giving them up for 40 days in a year?

Lent is associated with "Fat Tuesday" and the Mardi Gras celebration; which is nothing more than a drunken lascivious festival in which people freely "Let themselves go" to practice any immoral activity they can think of. The idea is basically to get it out of one's system in order to prepare for Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the 40 days of spiritual discipline (Lent). But they do so only to repeat the process the next year. Shameful! The command to "Abhor what is evil" (Romans 12:9) is to be observed every minute of every day in the life of a true saint. The grace of God teaches us that we should deny ungodliness and worldly lust (Titus 2:12) at all times, not just 40 days a year. The entirety of our lives should be devoted to living "soberly, righteously, and godly in this present age" (Titus 2:12). 🔍

HARD WORK PAYS!
