It’s interesting that while Paul was presenting the Gospel to Agrippa in Acts 26, Festus spoke up with loud voice and said “Paul, You are beside yourself! Much learning is driving you mad!” (Acts 26:24).

Folks sometimes think we’re off our rockers because we don’t join the world in their partying, drinking and immorality. But don’t get discouraged, we’re not serving the Lord to please people; we are serving the Lord to please God! Peter wrote “In regard to these, they think it strange that you do

not run with them in the same flood of dissipation, speaking evil of you” (1 Peter 4:4). Our pure lives are a spotlight to their wickedness. They don’t like their evil deeds being highlighted, so instead of changing their lives, they ridicule us for being righteous.

But sometimes the opposite occurs, and people come to the Lord because of your pure life. “*Having your conduct honorable among the Gentiles, that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may, by your good works, which they observe, glorify God...*” (1 Peter 2:12). It’s not crazy to serve God, it’s crazy not to! 🔍

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OUR SONGS

There are some essential truths we need to understand regarding the songs in our worship services. While there are several more than we will discuss in this article, the Bible tells us that our songs must be...

Sung. Not played, not whistled, not hummed; but sung! Notice the first word in Ephesians 5:19... “Speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, swinging and making melody in your heart to the Lord.” Whatever all is involved in psalms, hymns and spiritual songs, we know they are to be spoken, sung! We have no authority for mechanical instruments of music in worship; nor for whistling or humming. Singing is to teach and admonish (Colossians 3:16); but notes simply played, whistled or hummed cannot teach anyone anything! This takes words.

Spiritual. I’ve heard of churches singing songs like “My country tis to Thee,” “America,” “America the Beautiful,” “Dixie,” “Star Spangled Banner,” “When Johnny comes marching home again,” etc. These are great songs about our country and it is certainly ok to sing these songs in the home or any other setting, but the songs we sing in services are to be

“*Psalms and hymns and spiritual songs.*” Our songs are to praise the Lord, not the country. Some denominations include popular Pop, Rock, Rap, Country, etc songs in their services, no doubt to appeal to the young. This is unspiritual and unscriptural.

Scriptural. There are many religious songs in which religious error is taught. It is not my intention to do an expose here of these songs; I only want to emphasize the need for us to be aware of the words we are singing.

Song leaders especially need to take note. Study the teaching of the songs you have chosen before you lead them. Make sure they are scripturally sound. If you’re unsure about something, study it further, and/or ask your preacher or elder.

Remember, one of the purposes of our singing is to “Teach” one another (Colossians 3:16). This being so, if we sing religious error we are actually teaching and promoting religious error. Paul said “*I will sing with the spirit and I will also sing with the understanding*” (1 Corinthians 14:15). It behooves us to have a good Understanding what we’re singing, and if it’s error, we must not sing it! 🔍

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WATCH!

The New Testament has a great deal to say about this idea of watching. In discussing the Last Day, Jesus said, “*Watch therefore, for you do not know what hour your Lord is coming*” (Matthew 24:42). When bringing home the lesson of the parable of the ten virgins, Jesus said “*Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour in which the Son of man is coming*” (Matthew 25:13). In the story of the faithful and evil servant, Jesus said, “*The master of that servant will come on a day when he is not looking for him and at an hour that he is not aware of, and will cut him in two and appoint him his portion with the hypocrites. There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth*” (Matthew 24:50-51).

The Holy Spirit also had much to say about watching through the apostle Paul. “*Watch, stand fast in the faith, be brave, be strong*” (1 Corinthians 16:13). In discussing the final Day, Paul wrote to the church of the Thessalonians “*Therefore let us not sleep, as other do, but let us watch and be sober*” (1 Thessalonians 5:6). Peter exhorted his readers to “*Be vigilant*” (1 Peter 5:8). Vigilant means watchful.

So, why so much talk about watching, and what does it all mean? Well, in most of the contexts of the passages above the final judgment day was in view. The idea of being watchful is simply that of being ready; that is, being prepared. By being told to watch, we are being told to prepare ourselves for the final judgment day.

There are two facts here we must seriously consider.

FACT 1: We do not know when Jesus will return. Remember Jesus’ words, “*Watch therefore, for you do not know what hour your Lord is coming*” (Matthew 24:42). He went on in the next verse to explain that His coming will be as a thief in the night. Paul also told us that the coming of the Lord would be as a thief in the night (1 Thessalonians 5:1-2). Peter also said, “*But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night*” (2 Peter 3:10). What does this mean? Well, when a thief is planning to rob you, he comes when you do not expect him to come. He comes at night because that is the time you are likely to be asleep, and he has the cover of darkness to hide his presence. Further, if he is efficient, he will plan ahead, learning the times when you are home and when you are not, so as to take you by surprise so he don’t get caught. The fact is, a thief will not call you up and tell you he is planning to rob you, and when. The Lord’s return will take us by surprise, He could come any second, and then it will be too late to prepare.

FACT 2: We do not know when we will die. Many passages teach this idea (Luke 12:16-20; James 4:13-17). But if we will get ourselves ready to meet the Lord, it will not matter when we die or when He returns, because we will be watching, that is, we will be ready. Have you obeyed the Gospel? Are you watching faithfully? 🕒
