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WHY PETER SLEPT

Acts 12:1-10 tells about how Herod murdered John's brother James and then imprisoned Peter intending to kill him as well after the Passover. Peter was kept in prison, heavily guarded. Now, could you go to sleep in such a situation? Peter did! Peter slept because of...

Glorious Inner Peace. Peter had seen the risen Lord with His own eyes (Acts 1:2-3). He knew that Jesus was God's Son and this was a true source for peace. There was a time when Peter feared death and denied the Lord as a result; but no more! In the very face of death Peter could now find peace knowing that his soul was secure in the Lord Jesus. He understood and believed the Lord's promise, "And lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). "Great peace have those who love Your law, and nothing causes them to stumble" (Psalm 119:165). We too should live our lives with great inner peace, a peace that is kept charged through diligent prayer (Philippians 4:6-7).

God's Irrefutable Presence. Peter knew the Lord was with Him; so he slept. Again, he remembered the Lord's promise (Matthew 28:20). He had drawn near to God and knew the

Result would be God drawing near to him (James 4:8). During this most difficult and trying time he remembered God's promise, "I will never leave you nor forsake you" (Hebrews 13:5). In the face of seemingly certain death, Peter could say in his heart, "The Lord is my light and my salvation; Whom shall I fear? The Lord is the strength of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?" (Psalm 27:1). We should never allow difficult circumstances to cause us to forget the loving presence of God.

Godly Intercessory Prayer. Peter was a believer in prayer. In fact, after he and other were beaten, threatened and released with a command not to speak in the Lord's name, Peter, along with other disciples, prayed for boldness (Acts 4:23-31). Peter knew the early church was a praying church. He no doubt suspected the church would be praying for him; indeed they were! "But constant prayer was offered to God for him by the church" (Acts 12:5). What an example of intercessory prayer! Are you praying for others? Are you comforted at the thought of other faithful saints praying for you?

While facing imminent death, Peter slept! Obey the Lord and live your life with similar peace. ☞

OUT ON A LIMB

Zacchaeus was a chief Tax collector who was longing to see Jesus (Luke 19:1-10). When Jesus was passing by, Zacchaeus couldn't see Him because he "was of short stature." He went ahead of the crowd and climbed up into a sycamore tree, so when Jesus passed by, he could see Him.

Zacchaeus literally went out on a limb to see Jesus! He went out on a limb metaphorically also. Here was a rich man of society who humbled himself, risking criticism from his peers, in order to see Jesus!

Do you refrain from religion because you are afraid your friends will criticize you, make fun of you, or even reject you? Zacchaeus was willing to go out on a limb to see Jesus.

Folks today need to be willing to take the same chances. After all, the most important thing isn't whether or not our friends, family, or co-workers accept us. The most important and most essential thing is for Jesus to accept us.

He taught that those who are not willing to forsake mother, father, son or daughter are not worthy of Him (Matthew 10:37-38).

There were some Jews who believed in Jesus but would not confess Him for fear of being put out of the synagogue (John 12:42). They weren't willing to go out on a limb for Jesus.

Jesus accepted and honored Zacchaeus; and Zacchaeus repented and became a follower of Him. You, too, must go out on a limb to see Jesus and accept His teachings.

Don't go out on a broken limb by embracing a false religion which follows things not taught in Christ's doctrine; but hear the Gospel, believe in Jesus, repent of your sins, and be baptized for the remission of your sins (Mark 16:16, Acts 22:16) so you may be saved.

So, how about it? Do you want to see Jesus? The Tree's there, start climbing! Go out on a limb! 🗝
