

## SPIRITUAL WORK ETHIC

In another article we examined the biblical concept of a good work ethic, and the importance of one being a hard worker in this earthly realm. But more importantly, God has enjoined upon us a good work ethic in spiritual matters.

Paul informs us that God has created us “In Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them” (Ephesians 2:10). Add to this Titus 2:14 where Paul, in speaking of Christ, said “*Who gave Himself for us, that he might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself His own special people, zealous for good works.*” As the old song Says, “There is much to do there’s

work on every hand.” Many passages get specific as to what we as individual Christians should be doing, including visiting the sick and imprisoned, feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, assisting widows and orphans, etc (Matthew 25:35-37; James 1:27, etc). But we also need song leaders, teachers, leaders of prayers, etc.

The single most important work we can do for others is to share with them the Gospel (Romans 1:16). Jesus said He healed the sick, raised the dead, gave sight to the blind and hearing to the deaf, but most importantly, He said “*The poor have the Gospel preached to them*” (Matthew 9:5-6).

## THE PERFECT FATHER

A friend of mine who had several children once told me that he started out at a very young age as a father. He was still a kid himself, and was overwhelmed with the prospect of raising children. He finally decided that the best course to follow was to look to the perfect Father – God. He raised seven children, all of whom are now adults, all of whom are faithful Christians, and all his children who are married have spouses who are faithful Christians. What a legacy! In the Bible, we see that God, as the perfect Father...

**Provides.** In a general sense, God is the Father of all mankind in that He created all of us. The Lord taught that in a general sense God provides for all of His creation. “*For He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust*” (Matthew 5:45). But God has especially promised to provide for His children in Christ, both physically and spiritually. Physically, He has promised to provide those who seek Him first with food, clothing, and shelter (Matthew 6:25-34). Spiritually, Paul tells us that God “*Has blessed us with every spiritual blessing...*” (Ephesians 1:3); and Peter tells us that

God “*Has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness*” (2 Peter 1:3). James reminds us that “*Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights*” (James 1:17). A loving earthly father will also provide for his children both physically and spiritually (1 Timothy 5:8; Ephesians 6:1-4).

**Protects.** God is clearly seen in the Bible as a great protector of His children. “*I will both lie down in peace, and sleep; For You alone, O LORD, make me dwell in safety*” (Psalm 4:8). Through the full armor of God, God has provided us the protection we need from our adversary the devil (Ephesians 6:10-18). A Loving earthly father will provide protection for his children. Many fathers are abusive, and their children fear they will be harmed or even killed by their father. What a tragedy! Fathers need to seek to protect their children both physically and spiritually.

**Punishes.** Down through the ages, God has punished His children because He loves them (Hebrews 12:5-11). The Bible says, “*He who spares his rod hates his son, But he who loves him disciplines him promptly*” (Proverbs 13:24). ☞

# WORK ETHIC

One of the things I often think about as a new parent is how to properly instill a good work ethic into my child. This is something my dad did for me and I'm interested in doing it for my child as well. I've noticed that many children are brought up with more emphasis on "Play" than on work. Entertainment (TV, Movies, Games, etc.) has a proper place in our lives, and those of our children; but too much emphasis on these things can damage a child's work ethic.

Our Father in heaven has always enjoined upon His children a good, strong work ethic. *"The soul of the lazy man desires, and has nothing; but the soul of the diligent shall be made rich"* (Proverbs 13:4). This is one of a host of proverbs that address the concept of hard work as opposed to slothfulness. Proverbs 10:4; 12:24; 21:5 all address this issue. Proverbs 19:15 says *"Laziness casts one into a deep sleep, and an idle person will suffer hunger"* (Proverbs 19:15).

The New Testament is not silent on this issue. Paul wrote, *"For even when we were with you, we commanded you this: If anyone will not work, neither shall he eat"* (2 Thessalonians 3:10). In Ephesians 4:28, we are commanded to find an honorable job so that we might have something to give those who have need. But it's more than just having a job, one must be a hard working employee, laboring as if the Lord Himself were his boss (Colossians 3:22-24).

In addition to an over-immersion of

entertainment, there are other pitfalls when discussing a good work ethic. One of these is gambling. Gambling violates the golden rule of doing unto others as you would have them do unto you (Matthew 7:12). It also violates the fair compensation concept in that the gambler is seeking to take something from someone else without giving them anything in return. This is why many refer to gambling as "Stealing by consent." But what's worse, gambling instills into our youth the concept of getting something for nothing. This is one of the great woes of legalizing a State lottery.

Another pitfall is the danger of overworking. Some are known as "Workaholics." These are those who actually spend too much time in the workplace, causing them to neglect other important responsibilities in life; such as their wife and children. The Bible offers warnings for this as well; *"Do not overwork to be rich; Because of your own understanding, cease!"* (Proverbs 23:4). Other translations of this verse bear out the essential meaning to include the concept of making riches your goal when working. Those who work just because they want to be rich will work too much and neglect other essentials areas of their lives.

May God grant us wisdom in teaching our children the proper balance between overworking and under-working that would be pleasing to God, and beneficial to them throughout life. 🔍
