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WINNING THE SPIRITUAL WAR

The war we fight every day is one of a spiritual nature, not physical (2 Corinthians 10:3-6. In Ephesians 6:10-20, Paul tells us how to be strong in the Lord and win this war ...

Our Predator. Anyone who wants successfully defeat his enemy must first understand some things about his enemy. Our adversary is Satan and Peter depicts him as a predator, a lion, seeking whom he may devour (1 Peter 5:8). In Ephesians 6 we learn that he is well armed with fiery darts. He is very active and deceptive, seeking to deceive us with religious error (1 Timothy 4:1-5), and Sinful activity (Hebrews 3:12-13).

Our Panoply. The word “Panoply” means “A complete suit of armor.” God provides us what we need to fight and to protect ourselves against our predator (Ephesians 6:13-17). We gird our waist with truth, God's word (John 17:17) so that we can recognize religious error. The breast plate of righteousness refers to our doing of God's will, applying His word to our lives. Shodding our feet with the preparation of the Gospel speaks of our sharing the Gospel with others, The shield of faith speaks of our strong belief in God and Christ. This keeps

us from atheistic concepts that the devil saturates our society with. Faith gives us victory over the world (1 John 5:4). The helmet of salvation addresses the intellect. God provides us with intellectual truths in the Gospel to fight against the devils clever arguments for sin and error. The sword of the Spirit is the word of God. We must wield this sword in daily battles in order to defeat all the foes Satan puts in our path. Most of the elements of our armor are related directly to the Gospel. Being familiar with our own weapons is essential to winning the war. Study God's word daily (Acts 17:11).

Our Prayers. Without communication with our commander (God) we will lose the battle regardless of how good our armor and weapons are. Ephesians 6:19 insists that we pray “Always with all prayer and supplication.” We ask God for strength. We pray to Him when we are discouraged. We pray for wisdom to win the war. We pray for our spiritual leaders, we pray for our fellow spiritual soldiers.

How is your war with the devil going? Understanding your enemy, familiarizing yourself with the Gospel, and praying without ceasing will assure victory 🔍

How To PRAY

In the Bible, both Old and New Testaments emphasize over and over again the need to pray. Many people struggle with their prayer life either through a lack of discipline or a lack of understanding as to what to pray about.

If a lack of diligence is the problem, I would remind us of 1 Thessalonians 5:17, "Pray without ceasing." If we struggle with what to say when we pray perhaps we need a better understanding of the components of prayer revealed to us in God's word. 1 Timothy 2:1 gives us the basic components of prayer.

Supplications. This is the part of prayer where we ask God for the things we need. The root word for "Supplications" is "Supply." We ask God to supply us with the things we need. For example, "Give us this day our daily bread" (Matthew 6:11).

Prayers. Some are confused as to how "Prayers" can be an aspect of our "Prayers." The Greek word speaks to the worshipful and adoring aspect of praying. It could be properly translated "Praise." This is the part of prayer where we praise and magnify God's name. For example, "Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name" (Matthew 6:9). We praise God for Who He is and for what He has done and is doing for us.

Intercessions. This is the part of prayer where we go to God on behalf of others. We intercede for them. We pray for the sick, those traveling, those struggling with difficult times, those dealing with discouragement, etc. We pray for Preachers, Elders and other spiritual leaders in the church. We pray for brethren who have fallen away from the Lord. The list goes on.

Giving of Thanks. This aspect of prayer speaks for itself. Thanksgiving is one of the most mentioned aspects of prayers in scripture. God wants us to be thankful people! "In everything give thanks" (1 Thessalonians 5:18), "In everything by prayer and supplications, with thanksgiving" (Philippians 4:6-7), "Continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving" (Colossians 4:2). God has blessed us abundantly; there's so much to be thankful for. Giving thanks should come easily.
