GOD IS NEAR

"We give thanks to you, O God, we give thanks! For Your wondrous works declare that your name is near" (Psalm 75:1). Thankfulness is a recurring theme throughout the Bible. God wants His people to be a thankful people. Instead of being thankful to Him for His presence and wondrous works, the Israelites often turned to complaining and dissatisfaction. This verse displays why we should be thankful to God always – "For Your wondrous works declare that Your name is near."

God Is Near Through His Creation. The creation around us is wondrous, certainly the wondrous work of an Almighty God. How can we look up at the stars and not see His name written in the heavens (Psalm 8)? How can we not feel the reality of His existence when we gaze at a snow capped mountain, or look across the mighty waters of the sea, or feel the cool breeze in our face on a hot summer day? His hand is in everything around us. He is always near! His creation speaks to us of His existence and closeness; for "The heavens declare the glory of God; And the firmament shows His handiwork. Day unto day utters speech, and night unto night reveals knowledge" (Psalm 19:1-2).

God Is Near Through His Care. Whether they like it not, even the wicked enjoy the creation and blessings of God. If they have rain, sun, food, or clothing, it is because God willed it for them. They would not even draw another breath outside the will of the Almighty. "For He makes His son rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust" (Matthew 5:45). Sadder still is when we Christians feel discontented in life. Have we forgotten how near God is, even during the lean times, we should find comfort in His perpetual nearness?

God Is Near Through His Christ. "Christ" comes from a Greek word which means, "Anointed One." The Hebrew word meaning the same thing is "Messiah." The most wondrous of God's works is His indescribable gift of Christ on the cross. God has shown that He is near all mankind, willing and waiting for them to acknowledge His presence through obedience to the Lord, so that He might save them (2 Corinthians 9:15; Hebrews 5:8-9; 2 Peter 3:9). If you're outside of Christ, draw near to God through Him today (Mark 16:16; Acts 22:16). Grope for Him and find Him, for He is not far from each one of us (Acts 17:27). God is near!🔍

LOVE YOUR SPOUSE!

Most people are familiar with the words of the apostle Paul from Ephesians 5:25, “Husbands, love your wives.” Someone told me years ago that while the Bible commands the husband to love his wife, it never says anything about the wife loving her husband. They overlooked Titus 2:4, where the older women were to, among other things, “Admonish the young women to love their husbands” (Titus 2:4). We must love our spouses!

A Commanded Love. The thought may seem strange to some, but it is actually a command that we love our spouse. Paul commanded the men, “Love your wives.” Love isn’t just a mushy emotion, as some seem to think. It is that great divine love, agape Love! This type of love by definition is an active love; active good will towards others. Years ago, while speaking to a young man who was divorcing his wife, he told me, “I just don’t love her anymore.” I encouraged him to understand the command aspect of love. He had never considered that.

A Committed Love. Marital love is also a committed love. We are to be devoted to our spouse. The Husband is told to love his wife even as Christ loved the church (Ephesians 5:25). That’s a sacrificial love; for Christ shed His precious blood to purchase the church (Acts 20:28). My commitment for my wife should be so strong that I would gladly give my life for her. A woman once told a counselor, “I really think he would die for me, I just wish he would live for me.” If we’re not careful, our spouse can simply become a roommate. Merely someone we share a house with. We must be committed to our spouse. Love them. Plan and do things with them. Be interested in their concerns, their desires, their wants and needs (Emotional, physical, and spiritual).

A Consenting Love. Wives are commanded to submit to their husbands. Not with an, “Ok, fine, you’re the boss, whatever you say” attitude; but submission with respect (Ephesians 5:22). “Let each of you in particular so love his own wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband” (Ephesians 5:33). This consent and submission must also be present in the romantic, sexual aspect of the marriage. Paul deals with this in 1 Corinthians 7:1-5. “Let the husband render to his wife the affection due her, and likewise also the wife to her husband” (vs. 3). “Do not deprive one another...” (vs. 5). The sexual aspect of marriage isn’t a tool to be used for manipulation or punishment. It is an honorable privilege granted only to a man and woman who are married to one another, and they should be happy to consent to it (Hebrews 13:4).

May we all work harder at loving the spouse God has blessed us with, with the kind of love he has commanded. The result will be happiness, contentment, and peace within the home. 🔍
