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HOLD FAST

Have you ever heard or used the phrase, “Holding on for dear life?” In this article it is eternal life that is under consideration. And in order to finally receive our reward, we must certainly hold fast! The phrase “Hold fast” occurs several times both in the Old and the New testaments. Let's learn some lessons...

Hold Fast To Our Holiness. Job declared long ago, “*My righteousness I hold fast, and will not let it go; My heart shall not reproach me as long as I live*” (Job 27:6). He spoke this in the midst of severe personal suffering. We are sometimes tempted to do evil during hard times; to abandon our righteousness. But we must hold fast. Paul wrote, “*Hold fast what is good*” (1 Thessalonians 5:21). Satan would have us to give in, to give up, and to throw in the towel. He wants to convince us that it's just too hard, too difficult, too challenging to live holy lives in an unholy world. Don't give in, hold fast! Our reward will certainly be worth it.

Hold Fast To Our Hope. “*Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful*” (Hebrews 10:23). Actually, there are several passages exhorting us to “Hold” fast to our confidence, our faith, our faithfulness, etc. No wonder! Considering the onslaught of temptations we face each day to lay aside our faithfulness, to sin, and to jeopardize our eternal reward. In order to make it through seemingly impossible situations, Paul kept his mind focused on the invisible, the reward. He constantly contemplated “What it's all for.” (2 Corinthians 4:16-18).

Hold Fast To Healthy Doctrine. Paul told Timothy, “*Hold fast the pattern of sound words which you have heard from me...*” (2 Timothy 1:13). False doctrine and religious error abound in our society. This has always been the case ever since the devil made his appearance on the scene, and it always will be the case. Brethren are often deceived by error, so it is imperative that we resolve to hold fast, to cling tightly to the truth of the Gospel, lest we be led astray. Peter said that saints must continually grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus, “*Lest you also fall from your own steadfastness, being led away with the error of the wicked*” (2 Peter 3:17, see also verse 18). 🔍

ANGER

Anger: a strong feeling of displeasure or hostility.

“Abel, on his part also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of their fat portions. And the LORD had regard for Abel and for his offering; but for Cain and for his offering He had no regard. So Cain became very angry and his countenance fell. Then the LORD said to Cain, “Why are you angry? And why has your countenance fallen? If you do well, will not your countenance be lifted up? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it.”

Genesis 4:4-7

Cain was warned to “master” his anger. It was his decision: master it or be mastered by it.

ANGER

It is not a sin to be angry! Anger is an emotion that can be aroused in us. It’s not a matter of “if it can happen.” There are numerous places in the Bible where the words “the anger of God” are found. Jesus became angry (Mark 3:5: *After looking around at them with anger, grieved at their hardness of heart, He said to the man, “Stretch out your hand.” And he stretched it out, and his hand was restored.*)

CONTROLLING ANGER

Anger, unless controlled, is a springboard to sin. We must control our anger. If not, it will control us. The words spoken to Cain “sin is crouching at the door” makes it very clear that unless one’s anger is controlled, sin will follow.

Like a city that is broken into and without walls is a man who has no control over his spirit.

Proverbs 25:28

He who is slow to anger has great understanding, but he who is quick-tempered exalts folly.

Proverbs 14:29

He who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit, than he who captures a city.
