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SINGING IN WORSHIP

We often hear our denominational friends declare "You don't believe in music in worship." What they mean is that we don't believe in using mechanical instruments of music in worship. We believe in appealing only to Christ's doctrine for authority for whatever we do in worship (Colossians 3:17; 2 John 9). Regarding singing, consider from scripture...

The Right to Sing. God has given us the right (authority) to sing. "Speaking to one another in psalms, hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord" (Ephesians 5:19). Whatever "Psalms, Hymns and spiritual songs" are, they are to be spoken, not played. Paul said "Speaking to yourselves." "Making melody" comes from a verb which literally means "To pluck." The idea is to pluck on the strings of an instrument, such as a harp. But we know Paul isn't using the term literally because he specifies the instrument to be plucked – The heart. Since it is literally impossible to pluck strings on our heart, Paul must be speaking figuratively. He's simply demanding that we put our hearts into the singing, that we sing with the spirit and with the understanding (1 Corinthians 14:15).

The Reasons for Singing. Ephesians 5:19 and Colossians 3:16 reveal to us why God wants us to sing. We sing to teach one another. "Teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs..." (Colossians 3:16). It takes words to teach. Mechanical instruments do not produce words so they cannot meet the needs of the command. Further, those playing a wind instrument cannot sing, so they're neglecting the command to teach with words. We also sing to "admonish" one another. The Greek word denotes "To put in mind, to caution or reprove gently;--admonish, warn." Again, this requires words. Thirdly, we are to sing as an act of worship "To the Lord." Both passages above use the phrase "To the Lord."

The Rewards of Singing. We are rewarded from the satisfaction of having edified our brethren, and of having been edified by our brethren. We are rewarded from having praised the Lord. Ultimately, we are rewarded with eternal life for having kept the command of the Lord to sing to Him and to one another, thus simply doing what the Lord said without adding to His word by using the mechanical instrument.

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THE MEEK

“Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth” (Matthew 5:5). Meekness is not weakness. Meekness, as Jesus views it, is submissiveness to God’s word and will. Some hear the word of God and rebel against it, while others obey it (This is meekness!) “Therefore lay aside all filthiness and overflow of wickedness, and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your soul” (James 1:21).

The apostle Paul exemplified meekness. Someone says, “No way! Paul was dashing and daring, he traveled fearlessly around the world facing persecution and trials for the cause of Christ.” But remember, meekness is NOT weakness! Paul was not weak, but he was very meek. He wrote, “I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me” (Galatians 2:20). This is the very essence of meekness!

A Mustang is considered to be one of the fastest, strongest, and most

energetic of horses. Envision a wild Mustang running free in the wide open fields doing as he wishes with no restraints. Envision now this same Mustang being captured and harnessed, taken to the stable, and “broken.” Now he is tame. Does this mean he is now weak; that he has lost his strength, speed and vigor? Certainly not! They have simply been redirected to do the bidding of man. Paul lived his life killing Christians, and then he lived his life making Christians. He went from maliciousness to meekness. He possessed great zeal traveling from city to city imprisoning and killing Christians; persecuting them in a persistent and energetic way. But when he became a Christian, he used just as much strength, zeal, and energy - if not more- making Christians, as he had massacring Christians. What was the difference? He became meek. He redirected his zeal and energy towards serving the Lord.

The church today would grow with much more rapidity if more Christians would serve Christ as zealously as they once served sin. Blessed are the meek!
