Moses was forbidden to enter into the promised land because of his disobedience at Kadesh (Numbers 20). 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HEZEKIAH THE GREAT

The world has known some great men; men who excelled in their field of labor. Herod the Great was known for his great construction efforts. Alexander the Great was known for his conquests of Nations. The most important “Field” is the spiritual field. In this regard, we read of great men in the Bible. Let’s consider Hezekiah the Great, a king of Judah during the days of Isaiah the prophet. Hezekiah was....

Fervent in His Prayers. The best sermons on prayer always refer to the examples of Hezekiah. He literally took it to the Lord in prayer when he took Sennacherib’s threatening and mocking letter to the house of the Lord and “Spread it before the Lord” (2 Kings 19:14). Who can forget the prayer he prayed on his bed when he had been told by the Lord (Through Isaiah) that he would surely die. God heard that prayer and granted him fifteen more years of life (2 Kings 20:1-6). Jesus taught “That men always ought to pray and not lose heart” (Luke 18:1), and Paul commanded saints to “Pray without ceasing” (1 Thessalonians 5:17). Let’s be fervent in our prayers like Hezekiah.

Firm in His Purposes. Hezekiah

made some mistakes, but he was not wishy-washy when it came to his purposes. His mind was made up to rid his land of the idolatrous high places. 2 Kings 18:6 speaks eloquently of Hezekiah’s determined purpose in life, “*For he held fast to the Lord; he did not depart from following Him, but kept His commandments.*” Could these words be honestly engraved on your tombstone? We need to be firm of purpose when it comes to serving the Lord and obeying His commands. Whether it’s the command to assemble (Hebrews 10:25), the command to give (1 Corinthians 16:1-2), the command to care for the sick and needy (Matthew 25:35-36), et. al., let us be “*Not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord*” (Romans 12:11).

Fearless in His Principles. Unlike other kings, he refused to pay tribute to the evil king of Assyria; instead, he trusted the Lord to provide and protect (2 Kings 18:6-7). As Christians, we must hold firm to our righteous principles, even when the heat is on. Some too easily give in to temptation because everyone else is doing it. They fear being the oddball. Like Hezekiah, let us be strong and courageous (1 Corinthians 16:13).

HUNGER AND THIRST FOR RIGHTEOUSNESS

True physical hunger can be a very powerful drive. We have an example in the Bible of an instance in which folks were so hungry they were driven to eat their own children (2 Kings 6:29). I doubt that any of us has ever known or felt hunger to this extent; but this is just the kind of spiritual hunger and thirst that Jesus demands of His disciples. He said, “*Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be filled*” (Matthew 6:6).

Longing for knowledge of God’s Truths. There is a desire for knowledge of God’s word, and there is a desire to practice God’s word – To live righteously. It’s difficult to tell which comes first, but both are certainly indicated in the Lord’s statement. Some desire to know more, but they have no real desire to apply it to their lives. Perhaps they only want to impress others with their mental abilities. It’s certainly good to want to know God’s truths, but we are deceived if we think that merely knowing them will save our souls. “*But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves*” (James 1:22).

Living out one’s knowledge of God’s Truths. We shouldn’t just want to know the way of righteousness, we must also desire to live righteous lives. The both the wise and the foolish man heard Jesus, they both gained knowledge, but what set them apart was that the wise man actually applied what he heard to his life (Matthew 7:24-27). James 1:22 mentions both hearing and doing. Let’s develop a true hunger for learning God’s ways, and for doing them! 🔍
